IMPORTANT NOTICE FROM BROWARD COUNTY PUBLIC SCHOOLS:

As this school year comes to an end, we are adopting the following practice for the last week of school. Effective Friday, June 2, 2023, through Thursday, June 8, 2023, students will not be allowed to bring backpacks to school. Additionally, large purses or beach bag-style purses will not be permitted on campus during this time. A small pouch may be allowed for personal hygiene items. Lunches may be brought in a clear disposable container or clear plastic bag. While we understand that this may cause some inconvenience, we believe that this added measure is necessary to maintain a safe and secure learning environment for all students and staff.

<u>STHS Students</u>, your school-issued bookbag must be cleaned out and washed (gentle cycle) before returning it to STHS.

<u>SENIORS</u> who do not return their bag will be assigned an obligation for the cost of the bag that must be paid before cap/gown distribution.

Grades 9-11:

- Bookbags must be returned empty and clean.
- Students will be assigned their same bag upon return to school in August.





School Safety and Crisis

Preventing Youth Suicide: Tips for Parents and Educators

Suicide is preventable. Youth who are contemplating suicide frequently give warning signs. Do not be afraid to ask about suicidal thoughts. Never take warning signs lightly or promise to keep them secret.

Preventing Teen Suicide: Tips for Peers

Suicide rarely happens without warning. As a peer, you may be in the best position to recognize when a friend might need help and help them get it. You may see signs in person, hear about them secondhand, or see them online in social media. Never ignore these signs.



Risk Factors

- Hopelessness
- · Nonsuicidal self-injury (e.g., cutting)
- Mental illness and substance abuse
- History of suicidal thinking and behavior
- Prior suicide among peers or family members
- Interpersonal conflict, family stress/dysfunction
- · Presence of a firearm in the home



Warning Signs

- Suicidal threats in the form of direct (e.g., "I want to die") and indirect (e.g., "I wish I could go to sleep and not wake up") statements
- · Suicide notes, plans, online postings
- · Making final arrangements
- · Preoccupation with death
- · Giving away prized possessions Talking about death
- · Sudden unexplained happiness Increased risk taking
- · Heavy drug/alcohol use





ATTENTION PARENTS/GUARDIANS AND STUDENTS

As part of our District's ongoing focus on providing safe and secure learning environments, beginning on the first day of school, Monday, August 21st, 2023, only clear backpacks and bags will be permitted on campus for our students. All backpacks and bags must be see-through. Mesh and colored backpacks – even if they are transparent – will NOT be permitted.

The only allowable items that don't have to be see-through are small pouches used for personal hygiene items; thermal food containers carried inside clear lunch boxes.

ATTENTION: STUDENTS, PARENTS, GUARDIANS AND CAREGIVERS

ONLY CLEAR BACKPACKS AND BAGS ALLOWED ON SCHOOL CAMPUSES IN THE 2023/24 SCHOOL YEAR


As part of Broward County Public Schools ongoing efforts to provide safe and secure learning environments, beginning in the 2023/24 school year, ONLY CLEAR BACKPACKS AND BAGS WILL BE PERMITTED FOR STUDENTS IN ALL GRADES.

This proactive measure takes effect on the first day of the 2023/24 school year - Monday, August 21, 2023. As of that date, ONLY clear backpacks and bags (purses, duffel bags, fanny packs, lunch boxes, etc.) will be allowed on school campuses for students in grades pre-K - 12.

The only exceptions permitted are:

- A small non-transparent pouch for personal hygiene items.
- Thermal food containers carried inside clear lunch boxes.
- School-approved sport-specific carrying case for athletic equipment.
- School-approved instrument-specific carrying case for band equipment.

All backpacks and bags must be see-through. Mesh and colored backpacks are NOT permitted. even if they are transparent.

CLEAR BACKPACKS AND BAGS FOR THE 2023/24 SCHOOL YEAR FAQS

What type of clear backpacks and bags are permitted?

All backpacks and bags must be clear and made of transparent plastic or vinyl material and must not have any opaque or tinted parts. The backpack or bag may have side mesh pockets, but backpacks made entirely of mesh will not be allowed.

What happens if a student has a non-approved backpack or bag? Students with non-compliant backpacks will be subject to search and appropriate disciplinary action.

What about personal hygiene items?

A small non-transparent privacy pouch will be allowed for personal hygiene items.

What types of lunch boxes are approved?

All lunch boxes must be clear and made of transparent plastic or vinyl material. Students may bring hot/cold food containers. A thermos for hot/cold drinks is also permitted. These items must be stored in a clear lunch box or clear bag.

What types of bags are approved for athletic equipment?

Student-athletes are required to use clear duffel bags to bring their sporting equipment to school. Exceptions: Bats (softball/baseball) and lacrosse sticks may be carried in their school-approved, sport-specific carrying case.

What types of bags are approved for band equipment?

Band equipment must be carried in a school-approved, instrument-specific carrying case.

Do staff members have to use clear backpacks and bags?

Staff and faculty are exempt from the clear backpack requirement.

Do volunteers have to use clear backpacks and bags?

No, only students are required to follow the clear backpack and bag requirement.

Do school visitors have to use clear backpacks and bags?

Like staff and volunteers, visitors do not have to follow the clear backpack and bag requirement.

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Photo IDs Required at STC & THS!

All students, staff, parents, and community members must show valid PHOTO ID to enter campus. Sheridan Tech College and Technical High School require all visitors to check in through a Single Point Entry on the south side of the building. All staff and district personnel must have their School or BCPS ID Badge.
