

Kindergarten

First Grade

First graders have been very busy with different activities! Our students have read many well-known Dr. Seuss books and participated in fun activities in honor of him. We are working very hard with our students to ensure that they will be successful on the end-of-year reading test. In math, we will be studying data and measurement. We are also working on supporting the intermediate grades as they prepare for the FSA. Please continue to read to reinforce the academics skills being taught in the classroom. Second Grade

Our 2nd graders had a fantastic time on our field trip to Sawgrass Recreation Park learning about the Everglades. This month, students showcased what they had learned about black history during our Wax Museum night and did a wonderful job giving their speeches. In math, students are continuing to work on telling time to and working with coins and money. We are looking forward to continuing to learn about the life cycles of different plants and animals and our students are getting a hands-on opportunity to see plants grow from seeds in our garden.

Third Grade

February was filled with lots of fun learning experiences. We researched and completed projects on important African-American Inventors. Third grade is excited about earning FSA Rewards points to use on Rewards Friday each week in March. These points are earned by using their strategies, remaining focused, and showing great effort. Third grade teachers are reviewing reading skills, including editing, poetry, paired text, and text features, that will be useful on the FSA ELA test. We are also eagerly preparing for our upcoming FSA pep rally!

Fourth Grade

As we begin the month of March in fabulous 4th grade, we are excitedly polishing up our writing skills in preparation for the Writing FSA on April 2nd. In math, students have been delving into geometry. In science, students have learned about renewable and nonrenewable resources and will learn about weathering and erosion. Students have enjoyed Black History Month projects this past month in Social Studies. We loved the students' enthusiasm during this unit of study.

Fifth Grade

As we quickly approach our FSA Writing Assessment, students are eagerly preparing for this assessment. We are so pleased with the number of students who have taken advantage of the opportunity of attending Saturday Camp. Thank you allowing your child to come every Saturday, we really appreciate each of you! Since we are in Crunch Time, we ask you to please continue to encourage them to attend Saturday Camp to strengthen their skills.
