

# **Transportation Changes**

Please note, that due to security reasons, changes to your child's transportation status cannot be delivered via telephone. This is for the safety of your child, as we cannot safely identify callers via the telephone. Please help us by sending <u>any changes</u> with your child <u>in writing</u> to be delivered to the teacher the day before. Thank you for helping us to get our students home safely.



For the safety of our students, they should not arrive to school prior to 7:20 AM, as there is **NO** supervision available. Breakfast is served each morning beginning at 7:20 AM until 7:50 AM. Students must arrive to the cafeteria on time in order to have breakfast. The first bell rings at 7:50 AM. It is vital that all students arrive to school on time. The Front Parking Area Gate (Pine Island Rd.) opens at 7:15 AM is only to be used as a drop off/pick up area. The side Parking Area (Commercial Blvd.) is only to be used for buses.



#### Drop off

- For safety reasons cell phone use is prohibited.
- Only the front parking area (Pine Island Rd.) is to be used for drop off and pick up
- Please pull all the way forward, in order to keep the line moving.
- Remain inside your car.
- Once all cars have stopped, please allow your child to exit the vehicle.
- Students should exit from the passenger side of the vehicle.

#### Pick up

- Please have your car tag displayed EVERYDAY for faster service.
- Pull all the way forward before allowing your student in the car.
- Remain inside your car.
- Car line closes at 2:15pm, after which you will need to go inside to pick up your student, **identification is required**.

### **First Grade**

## Second Grade

March is an exciting time in second grade. We will be taking checkpoints to target our progress before our end of the year assessments. These checkpoints will tell the teachers what skills they need to reinforce. Please continue to encourage your child to read a minimum of 30 minutes each night. Students should be building stamina and be able to read for a steady thirty minutes. This does not come naturally it must be practiced daily. Students should practice mental math as well as it will be helpful with addition and subtraction facts and strategies. Thank you for all you do.

#### Fourth Grade

Fourth grade is working hard to master all the new and exciting challenges before us! Our Fabulous 4<sup>th</sup> Graders are preparing for the FSA Writing test. We are delving into Opinion Writing as well as perfecting our Informative Writing. We are working hard to make sure we have what it takes to score a 10 on both opinion and informative prompts. In reading we have been analyzing literature and informative text standards. In Social Studies we are learning about Florida's History. we are working on perfecting our understanding of fractions in Math. We are getting ready to transition into Geometry.

### Fifth Grade

We are quickly approach our FSA Writing Assessment and students are eagerly preparing. They are working hard on Opinion Essays. We are all looking forward to The Golden Pencil Awards! Our fluent writers will be recognized for their efforts in six different categories of writing. Students will be acknowledged for their ability to write a wellorganized, multi-paragraph essay.
