Miramar IB Diploma Assessment Policy

1) The instruction and assessment of the IB Curriculum at Miramar High School will align with the rigor, philosophy and criteria of the International Baccalaureate Organization.

a. Teachers will encourage and promote student creativity and cultural understanding within the boundaries of the curriculum criteria.

b. Students will be assessed using the curriculum criteria established in the subject appropriate curriculum guide.

2) The student grades will accurately reflect the rigor of the diploma program to ensure reliability of the results.

a. Lesson Plans and classroom syllabi will align with the subject guides.

b. Grades will be established based on reliable criteria that align with the standards of the subject.

3) Assessments will reflect the philosophy of the International Baccalaureate Program.

a. Assessments will incorporate international and cultural awareness and understanding.

b. Students will be taught the importance of objectivity, and an emphasis will be placed on avoiding cultural bias when necessary.

c. Teachers will make appropriate allowances for students working in a second language.

4) All lessons and assessment will show evidence of higher order thinking skills. Assessments must include evaluation, synthesis and analysis.

5) Teachers will be creative in their planning to include a wide-range of assessment tasks and instruments. Because students have different learning styles, and institutes of higher learning require diverse assessment, varied assessments provide a more accurate reflection of the student's abilities.

6) Teachers will use their professional judgment when determining grades. This judgment must include open-ended response and creative lesson planning to encourage student originality and inventiveness.
