Inappropriate Clothing
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> garments with slogans, emblems, motifs, stripes or patterns oversized pants, shorts, or skirts JEANS Long oversized coats or jackets Shirts or tops unbuttoned below the chest Sweatpants, sweatshirts (unless weather permits) Jogging or athletic attire Tight fitting pants, tops, muscle shirts, tank tops, tube tops, undershirts Tattered clothes, garments with holes, frayed pants, shorts, or skirts Cutoffs, mid-drifts, unbuckled pants, shorts or skirts Hats, caps, suspenders, chain belts Flip-flops, slippers, high heels, platform shoes, stilettos. Open toed or backless shoes are not recommended for safety reasons Any item not in accordance with the Dress Code Policy of Broward County Public Schools.
