Instructors assigned the one minute elevator speech for a job interview in a Maritime business to their junior and senior classes. A total of 160 students participated in the first round of the competition, this included presenting their speech in front of their peers and being judged by the teacher. The top students were then judged at a second competition, held at the school, by local Maritime business professionals and educators from the district. The finalists went to the REFIT boat show at the Broward Convention Center for the semifinal round. The top 5 finalists gave a final presentation in front of a large audience and Marine Industry judges. All five finalists were awarded prizes.
