BASIS DATA ENTRY FOR 18-19 INDUSTRY CERTIFICATION EXAM RESULTS

- The BASIS data entry for the 18-19 IC results is expected to be open for posting in late November. The program must be re-worked to include all the changes in the State Registered Career Theme Courses and that process takes place with the FLDOE in early November. If a student tests before that timeframe, keep track of the information on an Excel Spreadsheet so you can easily enter it when the BASIS system comes on-line. IMPORTANT TRAINING FOR ALL MIDDLE AND HIGH SCHOOL TLC'S/MICRO TECHS

- CTACE will be hosting a training on November 2nd, 2018 specifically targeting the Micro Tech's from each school to make sure they have all the tools they need to support CTE computer technology needs. Specifically, setting up and maintaining Certiport Console 8, GMetrix, Adobe CC, and other CTE softwares. We HIGHLY encourage all schools to make sure their TLC/Micro Tech attends this meeting as it is crucial to the success of CTE programs. This meeting will take place at Rock Island Professional Development Center in the Cafeteria.

CERTIPOINT EXAM LICENSES/VOUCHERS

- All unused Certiport Licenses were pulled from schools at the end of last school year. If you plan on testing this Fall, please email Jarrett Torrella at CTACE to request licenses to be placed into your school site inventory. Students who took a Certiport exam last year, should still have attempts left on their license (total of 6 attempts) and will not require a new license. Schools should only be requesting licenses for students after students have shown proficiency (700) on their GMetrix practice exams in Testing Mode.

MIDDLE SCHOOL CAPE DIGITAL TOOL LIST OF APPROVED EXAMS FOR 18-19

- The FLDOE has released a draft of the 18-19 CAPE Digital Tool List that do NOT include IC3 Spark, Microsoft Word, and Microsoft Excel. We are encouraging Middle School teachers to continue to work with students to obtain the IC3 GS5 Living Online, IC3 Key Applications, and IC3 Computing Fundamentals exams as they are still on the list and will qualify for Bonus FTE funding. We are also encouraging our middle schools to continue to work toward the MOS bundle certification which involves passing any 3 of the Microsoft Office Specialist exams (PowerPoint, Word, Excel, Outlook).

CANVAS LESSON'S FOR MICROSOFT OFFICE EXAMS

- If you are not aware, CTACE and Daniel Goldman from Sunrise Middle have developed amazing projects, activities, and teacher resource materials to assist teachers in achieving student success with the MS Office Exams (PowerPoint, Word and Outlook). In addition to these new projects and activities there are pre-built Canvas modules that include videos/assessments from Atomic Learning/Hoonuit, Videos/Challenges from GCFLearnFree.org, and assignments for GMetrix Practice exams.
- This Canvas course shell can be downloaded from The Commons in Canvas by searching for "CTACE MOS." Click on the "CTACE MOS Certification Course Shell" and then import the course into your existing, pre-rostered, Canvas courses. Once imported you can pick and choose which different materials to publish to your students. Each individual module has been uploaded as well, for your convenience. - As you are aware, Industry Certification Exams that are valued at a .2 bonus FTE on the CAPE State Funding List (<http://www.fldoe.org/core/fileparse.php/8904/urlt/1819icfl.pdf>) automatically articulate to free college credit at Florida State Colleges (BC, Miami-Dade College, Palm Beach College, etc.). CTACE AND NAVIANCE - A PERFECT MATCH FOR CAREER EXPLORATION ACTIVITIES

The lessons are in CANVAS. The Facilitators will support the students in realizing their strengths, goals, knowledge, and interests to guide career planning. The classroom teacher can then continue using the lesson with their other classes to help the students plan for life after graduation. DISTRICT PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT MANAGEMENT SYSTEM TO CHANGE

- Professional Development Standards and Support (PDSS) is preparing for the transition from the current Professional Development Management System, MyLearningPlan, to the new system called Learning Across Broward. Learning Across Broward (LAB) is scheduled to Go Live in January 2019. The new system will provide 21st Century features designed to enhance professional development access, planning, delivery, implementation, evaluation and reporting. End users will benefit from seamless integration with other district systems such as Canvas and Office365 as well as Single Sign On. Principal selected school support teams will be equipped with training and resources to support the deployment at each location beginning in October 2018.
