

Everglades High School Admission Criteria 2018-19

Cambridge Fast-Track for Highest Achieving students:

- Level 4 or 5 on 8th grade FSA Reading or 90%ile or higher on the PSAT 8/9 in Reading
- Completed Algebra 1 in middle school
- Only A's and B's in middle school
- Recommendation from two core teachers

Cambridge Academy with Pre-AICE courses in 9th Grade:

- Level 3, 4, or 5 on 8th grade FSA Reading or 80%ile or higher on the PSAT 8/9 in Reading
- Completed Algebra 1 in middle school
- A's and B's in middle with no more than 2 C's
- Recommendation from 2 core teachers



Course Progression at Everglades High School 2018-19

NEW Fast-Track Course Progression:

Grade 9: AICE Psychology and AICE Marine Science

Grade 10: AICE General Paper, AICE Thinking Skills and AICE International History

Grade 11: AICE US History, AICE English Language, and AICE Global Perspectives Grade 12: Students will continue a rigorous curriculum although they will already have earned the AICE diploma. Student will have the option to take additional AICE courses to earn additional college credits.

Traditional Course Progression

Grade 9: Pre-Aice courses to orient new students to Cambridge.

Grade 10: AICE Thinking Skills, AICE General Paper and AICE International History

Grade 11: AICE English Language, AICE US History and AICE Sociology

Grade 12: AICE Physics or AICE Environmental Management and AICE Global Perspectives




Cambridge and Florida Bright Futures

- Students who earn the Cambridge Diploma:
 - Plus 100 hours of Community Service = FAS Award
 - Plus 75 hours of Community Service = FMS Award
 - No GPA Requirement; No test score requirement!
- Students who complete the Cambridge Curriculum but do not earn the Cambridge Diploma:
 - Plus 100 hours of Community Service and 1290/29 SAT/ACT=FAS Award
 - Plus 75 hours of Community Service and 1170/26 SAT/ACT=FMS Award
 - No GPA requirement!



Cambridge and the Weighted GPA

- Regular classes:
 - A=4pts
 - ► B=3pts
 - ► C=2pts
 - D=1pt
 - ► F=0pt
- Honors Courses
 - A=5pts
 - B=4pts
 - ► C=3pts
 - D=1pts
 - F=0pts

- AP, AICE and DE course:
 - A=6pts
 - B=5pts
 - ► C=4pts
 - ► D=1pt
 - ► F=0pts
