New Grants Dashboard (cont.)

Check out the Grants Administration's new <u>Grants Dashboard</u> that offers real-time information on GA-supported grants for this 23-24 school year. This dashboard provides a consolidated view of all grants that are in development (in progress), have been submitted, and/or have been awarded.

The Grants Dashboard features the following:

- An overview of grants submitted, awarded and in progress for the year, creating a comprehensive snapshot of both potential and funded opportunities
- The grant amount awarded or requested for each grant, providing a quick assessment of the potential financial impact
- Filtering and sorting capability to easily filter and sort grants based on criteria such as grant type or funding source
- Real-time weekly updates, ensuring that the information is current
- User-friendly interface, making it accessible for all end users

How GA Can Help You



- GA can help to develop your idea by facilitating a group brainstorming meeting, conducting a needs assessment and creating a program plan.
- GA can help to identify funding opportunities through the Grant Funding Newsletter, cultivating donors, and providing individual research.
- GA can work with you to ensure a timely submission, seek School Board review and approval of the grant, and provide editing and writing support.
- GA can help set-up the grant account, support the grant agreement review and approval process, provide donor stewardship, and support media outreach efforts.
- GA can help you to manage the award by supporting the reporting process.
- If applicable, GA will liaison with the Accounting & Financial Reporting Department for assistance with the final financial report.

Remember Grant Contract/Agreement Review and Approval Process

All grant contracts, agreements, terms of reference or other legal documents that require a signature from a BCPS authorized representative are required to go through the District's legal review, approval, and signature process. Please reach out to GA staff for support.

A copy of all grant applications to external agencies must be submitted to the Grants Administration (GA) Department as soon as possible to obtain School Board approval. Grant contracts and funds will not be awarded without Board approval. A copy may be submitted via e-mail to grants@browardschools.com. All grant applications MUST comply with District policies and procedures, as well as support the District's Strategic Plan.

Athlete Mentoring Pilot Program

The **Florida Department of Education** has awarded BCPS **\$250,000** for the Broward County Student Athlete Mentoring Pilot Program to pilot mentoring for student athletes who participate in football, girls' volleyball, boys' and girls' soccer, competitive cheerleading, baseball, and softball at District high schools to be identified by the Equity, Diversity and School Climate Department and as approved by the Florida Department of Education. The primary goal of the program is to equip student athletes with the resources and skills necessary to build, sustain, and promote positive mental health. A secondary goal is to improve the overall school climate and culture through community service performed by the student athletes as part of the program.

Tip for the Day – Grant Writing Glossary

- **501(c)(3)** is the section of the Internal Revenue Code that defines nonprofit, charitable, and tax-exempt organizations. BCPS can partner with The Broward Education Foundation (BEF) since public schools do not have 501(c)(3) status.
- Audited Financial Statements are annual financial statements which have been prepared and certified by a Certified Public Accountant.
- Capacity Building Grants help organizations to increase their capacity to achieve their
 mission. This may include the funding of new staff positions; and the costs of consulting to
 help the organization learn how to manage their boards, increase their fund-raising
 capacity and expand services.
- Capital Grants fund building of endowments, building renovations and similar activities, construction or equipment.
- **Concept Paper** is a two- to three-page description of your organization and program. A concept paper often includes a need statement, project narrative, and budget.
- Corporate Giving Programs have very specific causes they will fund (the arts, environmental education, youth, health). Some companies have their own charitable giving department, while others have a separate foundation.
- **Direct Costs** are costs allowable by the funding organization, and are directly tied to the operation of the project.
- **Eligibility Criteria** is usually available on a grant funder's website. Before spending a lot of time and effort on a grant proposal, thoroughly read whether your organization or program is eligible for funding.
- **Evaluation** is how the organization assesses whether their project made a measurable difference.
- Form 990 is an IRS form that tax-exempt organizations are required to file annually for public record of financial information. Public schools are not required to have a Form 990.
- **General Support or Unrestricted Grants** are for general operating costs rather than specific projects.
- Goals are expressed as the overall vision of what you want your project to accomplish.
 Be careful about having too many goals because this could be viewed as either being too ambitious or too unfocused.
- Indirect Costs/Indirect Cost Rate (Sometimes referred to as "overhead" or "Facilities and Administrative Costs) are costs that support the management systems of the organization including public relations, accounting, payroll, marketing, registration and records, and counselor. Grant funders may or may not allow indirect costs.
- **In-Kind Contribution** is a noncash donation to a project.
- Letter of Intent or Letter of Interest (LOI) is a document that provides a brief description of the project or program for which funding is being requested.
- **Matching Funds** are cash or in-kind support contributed by the grantee to carry out a project. Some grant proposals require a match before funding a proposal.

- **Objectives** are what specifically will change, improve, decrease, or increase because of your project activities. Many grant writers use the SMART model: Specific, Measurable, Attainable, Realistic, and Time-Bound.
- Request for Proposals (RFP) or Request for Applications (RFA) is a type of solicitation notice in which a donor announces that grant funding is available and provides specifications required in the grant proposal/application.
- Restricted Funds are funds that must be spent for a specific purpose, as determined by the funder.
- **Unallowable Costs** are costs and categories of costs that cannot directly or indirectly be offset by grant money.
- Unrestricted Funds can be used for any purpose without any requirements or restrictions.

Requests for grants less than \$1,000 for kindergarten through grade 5 are due October 1, annually. Requests for grants less than \$5,000 for grade 6 through grade 12 are due March 1, June 1, September 1, and December 1, annually.
