#### **FPL NextEra Energy Grant**

#### FLDOE Awards Science of Reading Grant



The **Florida Department of Education** has awarded BCPS a competitive grant of \$1,500,000 to build the knowledge and implementation of evidence-based practices to increase literacy outcomes for all children birth through grade 12. Grant funds will be used to implement a "Science of Reading Initiative" at high needs schools through which teachers and school-based staff will build skills to effectively use evidence-based practices to improve literacy outcomes and reduce the achievement gap. The goal of the grant is to ensure alignment of BCPS's literacy practices to the science of reading. Grant funds were secured through a collaborative effort between Head Start/Early Intervention, Elementary Learning, Secondary Learning, Bilingual/ESOL, Exceptional Student Education, Family and Community Engagement and Grants Administration teams.

#### **BCPS and DonorsChoose Continue District Partnership**



**DonorsChoose** is an online giving platform where public school teachers create requests for classroom or program materials that can potentially be supported by individual donors or corporate sponsors. Since 2018, BPCS teachers have raised in-kind donations valued at \$5,149,581 and completed over 10,397 projects from 31,550 donors on DonorsChoose. Remarkably, 23% of the funding was from out-of-state sources! These projects vary from educational resources to laptops and other tools to enhance the learning environment and support student success. #### Student Scientists for Sea Turtle Conservation



**The Sea Turtle Grants Program**, funded by the sale of Florida's "Helping Sea Turtles Survive" specialty license plate, has awarded Nova Eisenhower Elementary School a grant of \$3,000. Grant funds will be used to provide students with materials and lessons within a Traveling Turtle Trunk to learn about sea turtles through experiential lessons. Student-led projects include utilizing quantitative measuring skills such as measuring, weighing and calculating numbers to predict population sizes of sea turtles and the use of qualitative skills by comparing sea turtle species through observing and describing specific animal conditions. 


#### **BCPS Receives Continued ESSER Funding**

BCPS has received a grant of \$12,956,446 from the Florida Department of Education through the US Department of Education Elementary and Secondary School Emergency Relief (ESSER) II Fund to provide evidence-based, comprehensive, summer enrichment and afterschool programs that address the academic and youth development needs of public-school students. The programs include whole group, small group, and/or one-on-one targeted instruction to provide immediate corrective feedback to remedy any deficiencies in the areas of literacy, science, mathematics, and/or other content areas as determined by student needs. ## **Grant Opportunity Spotlight!**



Toshiba America Foundation accepts applications from teachers who are passionate about making science and mathematics more engaging for their students. The foundation seeks to support teachers by providing funds to support classroom projects. Successful projects tap into the natural curiosity of students, enable students to frame their own scientific questions, and incorporate the expertise of community partners. Applications must be for project-based learning. Requests for grants

less than \$1,000 for kindergarten through grade 5 are due October 1, annually. Requests for grants less than \$5,000 for grade 6 through grade 12 are due March 1, June 1, September 1, and December 1, annually. ## **BCPS Grant Writer in Action!**



Name: Victoria Saldala

Position: Director, Bilingual/ESOL Department

Years of service: 34

How many grants have you been awarded and what is the total dollar amount awarded? I have had the honor of writing the Title III Grant for English Language Learners for approximately 15 years and the Immigrant Grant for 7 years. The combined total of those grants is over \$80 million dollars. I started writing grants as a classroom teacher and saw the difference it can make for students. I have also written grants in collaboration with colleagues which have totaled anywhere from \$5 to \$25 million dollars.

Which grant-supported project is your favorite? So many projects to pick from! If I had to narrow it to one project, it would be Rally to Tally for New Floridians. It impacts so many recently arrived immigrant students by providing them the opportunity to learn about our government while giving a voice to their ideas on how to better the community.

What is your process for filling out a grant application? I begin by identifying a team who can brainstorm ideas and be strategic about the projects we want to implement to support the grant requirements. We review data, survey stakeholders, draft the narrative and build a budget. It takes a few iterations before we finalize the grant.

**Do you have any grant writing tips?** If you want your grant to impact the audience it is intended for, then you have to truly believe and have a passion for the projects you are including in the grant. They have to be meaningful and relevant. Find a team who can help you write the grant and most importantly, help you implement and monitor.

## Tip for the Day: Grant Writing Glossary

- **501(c)(3)** is the section of the Internal Revenue Code that defines nonprofit, charitable, and taxexempt organizations. BCPS can partner with The Broward Education Foundation (BEF) since public schools do not have 501(c)(3) status.
- **Audited Financial Statements** are annual financial statements that have been prepared and certified by a Certified Public Accountant.
- Capacity Building Grants help organizations increase their capacity to achieve their mission. This may include the funding of new staff positions and the costs of consulting to help the organization learn how to increase its fund-raising capacity and expand services.
- Capital Grants fund building renovations and similar activities, construction, or equipment.
- **Concept Paper** is a two- to three-page description of your organization and program. A concept paper often includes a need statement, project narrative, and budget.
- Corporate Giving Programs have very specific causes they will fund (the arts, environmental education, youth, health). Some companies have their own charitable giving department, while others have a separate foundation.
- **Direct Costs** are costs allowable by the funding organization and are directly tied to the operation of the project.
- **Eligibility Criteria** is usually available on a grant funder's website. Before spending a lot of time and effort on a grant proposal, thoroughly read whether your organization or program is eligible for funding.
- **Evaluation** is how the organization assesses whether their project made a measurable difference.
- Form 990 is an IRS form that tax-exempt organizations are required to file annually for public record of financial information. Public schools are not required to have a Form 990.
- **General Support or Unrestricted Grants** are for general operating costs rather than specific projects.
- Goals are expressed as the overall vision of what you want your project to accomplish. Be careful about having too many goals because this could be viewed as either being too ambitious or too unfocused.
- Indirect Costs/Indirect Cost Rate (Sometimes referred to as "overhead" or "Facilities and Administrative Costs") are costs that support the management systems of the organization including public relations, accounting, payroll, marketing, registration, and records. Grant funders may or may not allow indirect costs.
- **In-Kind Contribution** is a noncash donation to a project.
- Letter of Intent or Letter of Interest (LOI) is a document that provides a brief description of the project or program for which funding is being requested.
- **Matching Funds** are cash or in-kind support contributed by the grantee to carry out a project. Some grant proposals require a match before funding a proposal.
- **Objectives** are what specifically will change, improve, decrease, or increase because of your project activities. Many grant writers use the SMART model: Specific, Measurable, Attainable, Realistic, and Time-Bound.

## Tip for the Day: Grant Writing Glossary Continued

- Request for Proposals (RFP) or Request for Applications (RFA) is a type of solicitation notice in which a donor announces that grant funding is available and provides specifications required in the grant proposal/application.
- **Restricted Funds** are funds that must be spent for a specific purpose, as determined by the funder.
- **Unallowable Costs** are costs and categories of costs that cannot directly or indirectly be offset by grant money.
- **Unrestricted Funds** can be used for any purpose without any requirements or restrictions.
