Here are a few recent highlights from District 3 schools:

• Aviation Academy@ATC, a School Partnership with the City of Fort Lauderdale! An effort to establish a world class Aviation Academy in Fort Lauderdale has been diligently pursued by a number of collaborating partners and is about to come to fruition. There is an overwhelming demand for highly skilled workers in this sector. In a presentation at the 9/17/2019 School Board meeting, it was announced that the first phase of this multi-tier effort will be the establishment of an Avionics System Technician program at Atlantic Technical College beginning in January 2020. - News from Northeast High School Congratulations to the Hurricanes' Samsung Solve for Tomorrow Team for moving on as state finalists in the competition! Also, Ms. Mabour's Lemelson-MIT project is still in the full patent process, after getting the status of patent pending last year. Northeast has added two dual enrollment courses with Embry-Riddle Aeronautical University, and the Alternative Energy class is learning GIS, Geographic Information Systems, with students aiming to become certified in this highly desirable field at the end of the course.
- A Huge thank you to the Rotary Club of Oakland Park/Wilton Manors for providing dictionaries to 3<sup>rd</sup> graders and Constitution books to 5<sup>th</sup> graders at

District 3 schools. The Rotary members do this every year and their civic leadership is greatly appreciated!

- Whiddon-Rogers Education Center hosted their annual Partnership Breakfast on October 8, 2019. Student representatives from each of the career pathways assisted in the program. Culinary Arts students prepared a delicious breakfast, TV Production students filmed and took pictures, Criminal Justice students provided escorts, Music Technology students provided music, and Business Management students were tour guides. Representatives from Broward College, Keiser College, and the technical colleges met with students to explain their programs and have students apply. Students and staff wore their favorite college shirts and accessories.
- Two students in the Whiddon-Rogers Middle School

  mentoring, and college readiness preparation. They
  will also receive a two-year college scholarship when

This was a fantastic opportunity for our students to be involved in an international cultural event. The theater students sang "Seasons of Love," Orchestra students performed "Waterfalls" by TLC, and the Visual Art students displayed three panels of their creation which honor the mark AIDS has left in the South Florida community. The World AIDS Museum partners with Broward County Schools to provide education in classroom and school assembly settings. On November 4<sup>th</sup> **NAGE also** celebrated the dedication of the Peace Pole they were awarded during the 10<sup>th</sup> Annual Choose **Peace Week** for the winning poster artwork of Gabrielle Anderson and Isabella Cubas.
