• News from Northeast High –On the Academic Front: NEHS is offering two Embry Riddle Aeronautical University dual enrollment courses next year. Student will have the opportunity to earn 6 college credits and sit for certification for a professional, FAA approved drone pilot's license. NEHS's passing rate for Cambridge AICE was 91% last year! Everyone is excited about the Rock Star teachers and students who made this happen! Finally, May 15th the STEAM IDEAS FESTIVAL 2019 took place at NEHS featuring speakers Dr. David Kolesky, Materials Engineer, of Harvard University, former NEHS alumni,

speaking on 3D Printing Human Tissues; and former alumni Dr. Chelsea Bennice, "Octo Girl", Octopus Researcher. In Athletics: The Girls Track team finished 3rd in the State with several athletes earning individual state titles and breaking a few school records! School records were set in the girls 4/100m relay, girls 4x4m relay and girls 800m run. The Girls 4x4m relay missed the state meet record by .027 sec. Top performers: Jan'taijah Ford-earned her 5th individual state title winning the Girls 400m and 200m. She is headed to the University of Southern Cal to compete in track. Amaya Thomas - 8th in Girls 100m and 9th in 300m Hurdles; *Jahyna Hill* – 6th girls 800m, (setting a school record), and 4x400 relay State champion; Rainaa Grant- 4x400m relay State champion (new school record); Samiya Harrison - 4x100m relay State runner-up (new school record); Giovanni Cunningham – 4x100m relay State runner-up (new school record); Janae Thomas- 4x100m relay state runner-up (new school record); Bertine *Eugines-* 4x100m relay state runner-up (new school record)*Kesona Hanson* – 12th place 100m Hurdles; Sarai Warrick – 4.800m- 16th place; Tasia Small – 4x800m 16th place; Tasia Benjamin- 4x800m – 16th place; Briana Williams- 4x100m relay state runner-up (new school record) & 4x400m State champion. Congratulations to each of you! Congratulations to everyone at Northeast High for a fantastic year of achievement!

- News from Fort Lauderdale High -CAMBRIDGE PROGRAM TOP OF THE WORLD **AWARD** can you imagine it, just think about it. This is how Watson Lubin ended his school year, by earning the highest score in the world on the Global Perspectives & Research exam at the AS level.
