

Meal Charge Policy

Students are expected to pay for their meal at the time of service. Broward County Public Schools encourages families to complete a meal benefits application to determine eligibility for free and reduced-price meals. All students must pay the full price for lunch unless designated through the Meal Benefits office to be eligible for free or reduced-price meals.

Parents must re-apply each year for their child(ren). If you have not applied to the program this year and/or have been changed back to FULL PAY - \$2 PER LUNCH -- then your student is accruing a debt for lunch meals taken.

New Telehealth Service for Your School

Your student has access to on-demand doctor visits whether they are at school or at home– through Hazel Health.

Families connect with Hazel's medical staff through messaging, by phone, and/or video so students can access care from home.




Is there a cost?

Hazel Health accepts most major insurance. Students covered by Medicaid plans pay \$0 copay for Hazel doctor visits, and other plans, including Florida KidCare, will pay the standard copay for an urgent care visit. Other insurance plans may have a copay or fees associated with a Hazel doctor visit. Contact your insurance company or Hazel customer service to verify. Financial assistance is available to students without health insurance, ensuring all students have access to Hazel services.

¿Hay algún costo?

Hazel Health acepta la mayoría de los seguros principales. Los estudiantes cubiertos por los planes de Medicaid pagan un copago de \$0 por las visitas al médico de Hazel, y otros planes, incluyendo Florida KidCare, pagarán el copago estándar por una visita de atención de urgencia. Otros planes de seguro pueden tener un copago o tarifas asociadas con una visita al médico de Hazel. Póngase en contacto con su compañía de seguros o con el servicio al cliente de Hazel para verificar. La asistencia financiera está disponible para los estudiantes sin seguro médico, lo que garantiza que todos los estudiantes tengan acceso a los servicios de Hazel.
