Established in 1915, Broward County Public Schools (BCPS) has been a proud and visible champion for public education for over 100 years. It is the sixth largest school system in the United States, serving approximately 260,000 pre-K through 12th grade and 110,000 adult students in 241 traditional schools, centers, technical colleges and 93 charter schools.

BCPS is the first fully accredited school system in Florida and the first public school district in the nation to confer an online high school diploma through the pioneering Broward Virtual School curriculum. Diversity is a BCPS core strength. Students reflect the makeup of Broward County, the most diverse county in Florida, representing 177 countries and 151 languages.

BCPS values its strong connections with families, local businesses, organizations and community members. The District focuses on ensuring stakeholders are informed and have opportunities to provide input on strategic goals, educational topics and student mental health. These core qualities helped BCPS emerge as a leader for ensuring safe and healthy schools during the COVID-19 pandemic.

The District's quick and flexible response, combined with strong systems and community support, allowed BCPS to:

- Pivot quickly to an eLearning platform after becoming the first district in Florida to close its physical campuses at the onset of the pandemic.
- Close equity gaps by distributing more than 120,000 laptops and learning devices to students and ensuring families, regardless of socioeconomic status,
- Ensure students had access to the internet at home or through mobile hot spots.
- Implement strict mitigation policies to effectively control community spread while optimizing student learning.

Despite the many challenges faced during the pandemic, in 2020, BCPS achieved its highest-ever federal graduation rate of 89.2% for all schools, and 97.1% for traditional high schools.

To be considered for this opportunity, candidates must complete a formal application file online and include a CV/ resume, three to four active letters of recommendation, and a personal letter explaining their experience and qualifications for the position, along with their reasons for pursuing the role.

DEADLINE AND SELECTION

Once applications are reviewed and preliminary interviews are conducted by Ray & Associates, the top candidates will be shared with the School Board for consideration. Interviewed candidates are chosen solely by the Board. Applicant names, resumes and submitted applications are subject to Florida's public information laws.
