Our multiage team strives to create classroom communities where children think of each other as not just classmates, but as cherished friends and learning partners. To make this happen, we provide opportunities for our multiage students and families to engage with one another outside of school.

In October, we will be having our annual Trunk or Treat. This has been one of our favorite events and we are thrilled to be able to host it, once again, this school year. The parking lot will be filled with over 80 cars and 200 kids. We know our families will not disappoint with their creativity.

In our classrooms, K/1 and 2/3 students are writing small moment stories. This unit enables them to write with detail, including showing a character's actions, dialogue, and internal thinking. As they produce their piece, they will move with independence through the writing process, choosing an idea, planning their writing across pages of a booklet, and revising to bring more detail and life to their stories. We look forward to publishing day.

As our slogan this year states, MULTIAGE is my HAPPY PLACE!



It's hard to believe our kindergarten students have completed the first quarter and have learned so much already. We are excited for our Fall Festival and parade at the end of October and look forward to engaging in additional learning fun as we get into Thanksgiving and the holidays.

In second quarter, the students will continue to learn and practice Phonemic Awareness and Phonics skills through multiple learning experiences. We will learn new reading strategies and through shared, small group and interactive reading, kindergarten students will practice comprehension skills including retelling, main idea and details, and character and setting. All these activities will help them flourish into young readers.

In math, we will continue to explore and compare numbers, as well as begin working on addition concepts, using a variety of manipulatives.

In Science, we will be learning about living things. We will be digging deeper into plants and animals, as we compare, observe, and explore.

In Social Studies, we will be comparing families "then and now", as well as beginning to learn about Geography.

We love watching our students learn and grow each day and we thank you for all your support.



First grade is happy, safe, and learning! We are moving and grooving into the second quarter of the school year. Students will use grade-appropriate phonics and word-analysis skills to decode words accurately. First grade readers will identify and explain the moral of a story and identify the topic/relevant details of an informational text. In the area of math, we will build upon our subtraction concepts and strategies. These skills will prepare us for base ten operations. Our first-grade scientists will explore the big idea of interdependence and switch gears in Social Studies to historical knowledge, learning about celebrations and national holidays. We encourage you to read daily with your child and strive for those i-Ready goals.



Fall is in the air and exceptional learning is happening in second grade. This month 2nd graders are hard at work learning about scientists, science tools, and the scientific method. We have started our new reading series and are learning about habitats and main ideas, details, and text features. In math, the students are working on addition and subtraction. The kids are excited to write expository stories about animals. We are having a chilling great



time in 2nd!

4th grade is learning how to work in reading and math groups! We have been working in centers to master our skills. In math we are learning how to multiply using place value in several different ways. Although we are working on all our reading skills this month, we will focus on reading informational text. We are learning how to find the main idea, make inferences and how to read technical and historical texts. We are looking forward to our upcoming field trip on Nov.15th called Byte Sized Adventure in Space!



Our third graders have been hard at work and having fun learning as we wrap up the first quarter and begin the second quarter. We have established our reading and writing communities working in small peer groups and making connections between the reading and writing workshop. Students have been setting goals as readers to deepen their understanding and strengthening their endurance independently.

In writing, we have been working on small moments and developing our personal narratives into thoughtful pieces as we celebrate our 3rd grade authors. The third graders have also been learning many different math strategies with addition, subtraction, and multiplication. We have also connected these strategies to better understand multiple step story problems and breaking them into parts.

Our awesome students have also been studying Animals and Plants in Science and will learn about different forms of energy. In Social Studies we learned about maps and will learn about culture and Veteran's Day. We will be celebrating Government Day on October 21 and have our Fall Festival on October 29.

The third-grade teachers are very proud of the progress their students have made this first quarter of the school year and thankful for all the support of the parents in their partnership to make this a great year together.



Fifth grade is excited to be back in school. We have been hard at work for the past quarter. Some curriculum updates are:

Math: we have done place value, multiplication, and expressions. We are now dividing whole numbers, and next up are decimals.

ELA/Writing: In literature we have covered key ideas and details, citing accurately from text. We've also learned about craft and structure, figurative language, and point of view. We are working on informative writing.

Science: We started with the scientific method – the practice of science, and characteristics of scientific knowledge. We are working on Earth Systems and patterns – water cycle, weather, extreme weather preparedness. Next, we will cover space, we will have an in-house "Intergalactic Space Adventure" field trip in November.

Fifth graders will participate in Student Council activities as well.



Media Center

The Media Center is filled with student activity. 5th graders are back to being Media Helpers and the Morning News is now live, thanks to Mr. Grayson, our micro tech. Checkout is taking place in 1st-5th grade and kindergarteners will begin this month.

Kindergarten and first grade students have focused on Media procedures, book care and choosing good fit books. Students will continue with choosing good fit books while they begin looking at genres. They have begun listening to the Sunshine State Reading Award Jr. books and they will vote on their favorite one in the spring.

Second through Fifth grade students have also focused on Media procedures and choosing good fit books. They are working on updating their Beanstalk accounts and will be participating in Digital Citizenship activities this month. The Sunshine State Reading Award program began on October 1st and students will be learning about the books and authors in the coming months. It is optional for 3rd-5th grade to independently read the books, but highly encouraged with a celebration at the end of the year.

STEM

In STEM this quarter we will be adding Legos to the list of activities. In addition, we will be building towers, cars, and creating a variety of hands-on projects.

ART

The first day of Art students created a self-portrait that is now hanging in the hallway in a paper mural. The kids enjoy looking for themselves among all the small pictures. We are currently completing our fall painting project and are looking forward to starting collages in the next quarter.

If your child has not brought in a sketchbook, please try and get one in since we are going to start using them this quarter. If your child had one here prior to virtual learning and it had not been returned, it might be in the bins under my white board. We continue to use the same sketchbooks so that the students can see how they grew as an artist each year!

PE

We are going to continue moving and having safe fun in PE! During class, we work on developing strategy and motor skills. Another important skill that we are working on is good sportsmanship.

Reminder, please wear sneakers to PE and don't forget your water bottles!

Music

This month in the music department we are studying rhythm, beat, pitch and the music staff using a variety of fun games and activities.

The HHE Chorus has also been working hard at producing an exhilarating Holiday concert for everyone to enjoy!
