

Student & Staff IDs

ID Badges must always be worn and visibly displayed by students, faculty, and staff while on campus. Additionally, individuals visiting campus must wear some form of identification (district-issued identification badge or site\(\text{M}\)based generated visitor or volunteer badge) while on campus. Upon entry to campus, all visitors must be processed through the RAPTOR System. This includes, but is not limited to, parents, District staff, vendors, volunteers, and members of the public. An official photo identification will be requested. Your name, date of visit, time of arrival, purpose for visit and time of departure will be reported in a visitor's log.

Student Transportation & Fleet Services

Eligible students needing bus transportation for the upcoming school year MUST register for a bus assignment. Use the webpage below to register and guarantee a bus assignment for the first day of school. Students who registered to ride last year (SY 22/23) but did not ride the bus last year must register using their student accounts (06 accounts).

Newly enrolled students to Broward County Public Schools, need an assigned student ID prior to registering to ride. Please contact your school to get a student ID. It could take several days for your student information to populate in the transportation database (approx. 3-4 days).

NOTE: Programs such as ESE, 504, Foster, Homeless, and Teen Parent bus registration will continue to be processed by schools using Special Transportation Requests.

Student Drop-Off and Pick-Up

Students should be dropped off and picked up in the parent loop for arrival and school dismissal. We offer several programs and activities that are beyond the regular school day. Students must remain with the adults in charge while on campus. Students who are not involved in approved before and after school programs/activities must exit the campus if they are not supervised. Please ensure that you have a process in place for your child to exit our campus by 3:10 pm if not in a supervised activity.

Student Early Sign-Outs

Per School Board Policy, no student sign outs will be processed after 2:10 pm daily. Also, anyone picking up a student must have parental permission and be of legal age. All parents/guardians and visitors must come through the front office, show your ID to the camera and state your reason for the visit before being buzzed in.
