# What's Happening in 12<sup>th</sup> Grade?

Welcome to the last stretch of your high school career! Although your high school journey is in its final year, it is not time to relax just yet! Seniors still have many responsibilities from now until graduation! The focus must remain on maintaining a GPA of 2.0 or above, turn in your service hours (250 will get you a silver cord to wear at graduation), take the ACT and SAT for college entrance and apply to colleges and for scholarships!

Many students still have classes to recover in order to meet all their graduation requirements. If you have not started the recovery process, you are in danger of not graduating! If you still need to meet the reading requirement for graduation, ACT tutoring is offered through the YMCA on Tuesdays and Thursdays for free. Students, it is important that you frequently log into Naviance to complete the assigned tasks, search for scholarships and find the college that is the right fit for you.

Senior activities are coming up quickly and in order to participate you must be on track for graduation! Meaning that attendance is on point, missing credits are being recovered, GPA is above a 2.0, service hours are turned in, no outstanding obligations, and passing current classes! Also, remember that your senior contract must be signed and turned in to your English teacher. Every senior must have a signed contract on file in order to participate in senior activities. If you have questions or concerns, I'm in the cafeteria on Black Days or in my office before school.





Juniors have completed the first quarter of the 2018-2019 school year. During this first quarter they have made several academic decisions regarding course selection. They began with making decisions about what courses to take for this school year. In making this decision they were faced with continuing vocational pathways. Some of the vocational pathways offered at Boyd Anderson High School are technology, culinary, and aerospace. Grade eleven students are also at a pivotal point of deciding whether they plan to attend an institution of higher learning. This major decision impacted their course selection as well because they were faced with deciding a course in a secondary language. Boyd Anderson High School offers courses in French and Spanish. An additional decision the junior students were faced with was the challenge of credit recovery. This is a course enrollment process to recover previous credits not earned because of failed grades. Some of the options available for students to choose from are Broward Virtual On-line through school Florida Virtual On-line school, or night school. To complete on-line coursework, some of the students chose to attend Boyd Anderson High School YMCA after-school program. These academic decisions have placed the juniors in a very good place toward the bridge to senior year.
