

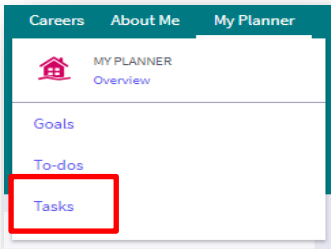
## Overview

You can use Naviance Student to discover personal interests and research careers and colleges during high school.

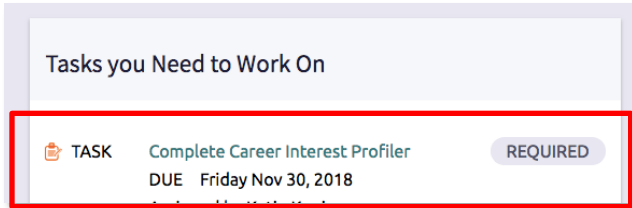
The **Career Interest Profiler assessment will help you uncover your personality type, identify the careers that are most promising, and learn detailed information about each one.** Knowing your strengths, values, personality, and skills will decide which career choice best fits you.

## Step 1: Accessing the Task

1. To get started, **click on My Planner**. Then **click on Tasks** to view the tasks you need to complete.

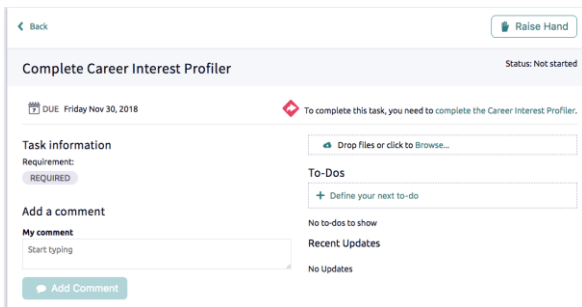


2. Select **Complete Career Interest Profiler** under Tasks You Need to Work On.



3. There are several action items available after you click the task. **You can:**


- **Add a comment** if you would share a viewpoint/remark with your counselor.

## Step 2: Accessing the Career Interest Profiler





## Step 3: Viewing Career Interest Profiler Results

1. This assessment generates your Holland Code with a brief description of the personality code. It also lists your personality codes in ranked order along with matching careers.



**Your Results**

**Investigative** 19  
Investigative occupations frequently involve working with ideas, and require an extensive amount of thinking. These occupations can involve searching for facts and figuring out problems mentally.

**Artistic** 18  
Artistic occupations frequently involve working with forms, designs and patterns. They often require self-expression and the work can be done without following a clear set of rules.


**Enterprising** 17  
Enterprising occupations frequently involve starting up and carrying out projects. These occupations can involve leading people and making many decisions. Sometimes they require risk taking and often deal with business.

**Conventional** 16  
Conventional occupations frequently involve following set procedures and routines. These occupations can include working with data and details more than with ideas. Usually there is a clear line of authority to follow.

**Social** 14  
Social occupations frequently involve working with, communicating with, and teaching people. These occupations often involve helping or providing service to others.

**Realistic** 13  
Realistic occupations frequently involve work activities that include practical, hands-on problems and solutions. They often deal with plants, animals, and real-world materials like wood, tools, and machinery. Many of the occupations require working outside, and do not involve a lot of paperwork or working closely with others.
