 - If available, standardized test scores will be sent home in the last report card of the school year. We will also provide access to Clever: Broward SSO through browardschools.com/sso to view test scores.
- 4. Provide parents reasonable access to staff. Specifically, staff will be available for consultation with parents as follows:
 - Staff will be available for consultation with parents before and after school by appointment.
 - *Phone messages and emails will be returned within 24 hours.*
 - All parents must report to the office and present their government issued ID to sign-in.
 - Administration, Guidance and the School Social Worker will meet with parents to discuss school related issues by appointment as well.
- 5. Provide parents opportunities to volunteer on campus or participate in their child's class, and to observe classroom activities as follows:
 - By going online to volunteer services at <u>www.getinvolvedineducation.com</u>.
 - Field trips, mentoring, and assisting teachers with classroom activities.
 - Parents may observe classroom activities for 60 consecutive minutes with 48 hours' notice to teacher and with administrative approval.
- 6. Provide opportunity for parents to plan and review school improvement through attendance at SAC meetings.
- 7. Provide parents with information about Title 1, Part A programs.
- 8. Inform parents of curriculum and assessments used to measure their child's progress.

9. Notice to parents when their child has been assigned or taught by a teacher that is not highly qualified for four weeks or more (section 200.56 of the Title 1 Final Regulations 67 Fed. Reg. 71710, Dec. 2, 2002).

Parent Responsibilities
