

Course Selection Checklist for Parents

When collaborating with your student to complete the course selection process, please be sure to review the items below and clarify any questions you may have prior to submitting the form to their Science teacher by January 22nd.

Q & A Scheduling Session on Saturday, January 19th from 9:00am-1:00pm (H.S. Media Center).

- Student should complete (legibly) the top front of the course selection sheet.
 - First and Last Name
 - Student Number
 - Science Teacher
- Please read the entire front of the form as important information is reviewed.
- Be sure to review your student's course selections and make sure that you and your student sign the front of the Course Selection Sheet.
- Parent/Guardian must read and complete the Consent to Post Student Information (inside flap). This will help facilitate everyone finding the proper place to be during the busy first week of school.
- If requesting an override of a teacher's recommendation, Parent/Guardian and Student must read and complete the Course Recommendation Override Form on the back of the course selection sheet.
 - Write the Recommended Course and the Parent/Guardian Preferred Course.
 - A reason **MUST BE PROVIDED** on the form by a parent to override a course.
 - A parent signature on the bottom is **REQUIRED** to override a course.
 - The school reserves the right to deny an inappropriate override request.
- DO NOT** write on the lines in the area where it states **FOR GUIDANCE USE ONLY – DO NOT WRITE ON THE LINES BELOW**. A School Counselor will complete this section.
- If there is a line to the left of the course a teacher's initials are required for approval.** A core teacher's initials are required for ALL core classes and any elective course that is level 2 or higher (i.e. Spanish 2).
- Students should **CIRCLE 7 CLASSES** that your student and the teachers have selected.
- Student should select and write two Alternate Elective Choices on the lines in the box labeled **Alternate Elective Choices**. **These courses may be on your schedule... CHOOSE WISELY!!!**
- For students who currently earned a level 1 or level 2 on the FSA ELA it is **MANDATORY** to take a reading class.
- Career Technical Education Programs* are a **MANDATORY 3 YEAR COMMITMENT** and one course must be taken every year for a minimum of 3 years. Programs must be completed prior to graduation.
- World language is **NOT** required for a standard high school diploma. However, the Florida State University System (SUS) requires a minimum of 2 consecutive years of the same world language to be considered for admissions to a four year university. More selective post-secondary institutions may require 3 years of a world language. See your School Counselor for more information.
