Review in Study Plan with "Learn" and "Practice"

Students can review and practice what they are learning in class by selecting "Learn" and "Practice" from their Study Plan for each subject. Students can view videos, complete practice questions, and review their mistakes from the detailed results screen at the end of each activity.

What is Liftoff?

Liftoff is an adaptive intervention program that will help your child address and recover math & reading academic gaps in their learning.

How Does My Student Use Liftoff?

1. When your student logs in to the Progress Learning site, they will click the Liftoff icon in the top left-hand corner of the student dashboard.
2. Students will then click on "My Galaxies" and click on the topic next to the rocket. The rocket will move up when they score 80% or higher on the topic and earn their galaxy star. Their mission is to get their rockets all the way to the top for each domain and a star on every topic within that domain!



***My Galaxies will populate once the teacher has administered the diagnostics in class.**

Student Logins

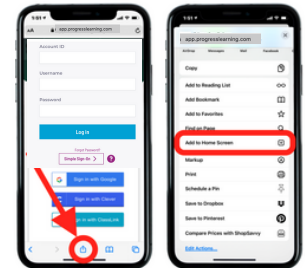
If Progress Learning is rostered through ClassLink, Clever, Google Classroom, or Canvas students will not need a separate password for Progress Learning. They will log in through their school portal and click on the Progress Learning logo on their dashboard to log in to their account.

Connecting at Home

Follow these steps below to set up easy sign-in access for your students on your home devices.

Set Up Easy Access for Students on iPad or iPhone

1. Launch Safari on your iPhone or iPad.
2. Navigate to the Progress Learning Login page. (<https://progresslearning.com/login/>)
3. Tap the Share icon (the square with an arrow pointing out of it) at the bottom of the screen.
4. Scroll down to the list of actions and tap Add to Home Screen. (If you don't see the action, scroll to the bottom and tap Edit Actions, then tap Add next to the Add to Home Screen action. After that, you'll be able to select it from the Share Screen.)



5. Type a name for your site link. This will be the title that appears beneath the icon on your Home screen.
6. Tap Add in the top right-hand corner of the screen.
