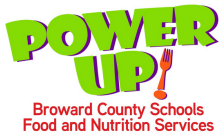

FLHS Re-Opening Student Reminders

DO NOT LEAVE HOME WITHOUT THESE ESSENTIAL ITEMS

Your CHARGED device	Bring your personal or school-issued laptop.
Power Cord	You will be able to charge your device in your classes.
Mask	Your mask MUST always be worn. It will need to cover your nose and mouth.
Student ID	Bring your ID from the previous school year, or if you are new to FLHS, bring your ID from your previous middle/high school.
Water Bottle	Water fountain stations will be closed; therefore, it is recommended that you bring your own water bottles daily.
Earphones	Please bring headphones that plug into your device. These will help with audio echo and feedback.

FRIENDLY REMINDERS

- Always look for signage indicating movement in the halls.
- Make sure wear your mask correctly (mouth and nose **MUST** be covered).
- Be sure to physically distance – maintain 6 feet apart from others.
- In the mornings report to the patio and café.

TECHNOLOGY TIP



BCPS Information Technology Division requests that students who have never changed their password from its default, immediately change their password following these steps:

- Log on to: <https://sso.browardschools.com>
- Look on the top right for your name and click it to get the Change AD Password dropdown. Click the drop down, and please choose a new password that is complex (minimum 8 letters, numbers, or symbols, in either upper case or lower case).
- Your BCPS online password is now changed! Whenever you access Clever SSO, or other BCPS applications, use this new password.

SPOTLIGHT ON MATH

Wondering what practices have been put in place to make sure that our students are successful in math? Here are some of our best practices:

- Prerecorded lessons that students can access and rewatch at anytime.
- OneNote for notes. Students can write directly in the virtual notebook or upload pictures of their notes to the pages. Practice and work can be uploaded to the notebook and seen in real-time.
- Khan Academy - SAT practice tailored to individual student strengths and weaknesses.
- The use of polls to gauge student understanding and allow for student feedback.
- Delta Math - great online resource for independent practice. It is also used as a homework and testing platform.
