PERSONAL FINANCIAL LITERACY REQUIREMENT

Students entering ninth grade beginning in the 2021 – 2022 school year and beyond, must complete a 0.5 credit Personal Financial Literacy course as a local graduation requirement. Qualifying courses include: Personal Financial Literacy (Course #2102372), Personal Financial Literacy Honors (Course #2102374). An equivalent Dual Enrollment, Broward or Florida Virtual School course will satisfy the requirement. The School Board is committed to ensuring that students have the skills and knowledge necessary to be College, Career and Life Ready. We will provide more information as we receive guidance on the scheduling of students.

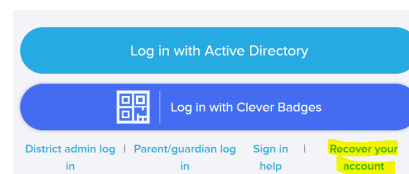

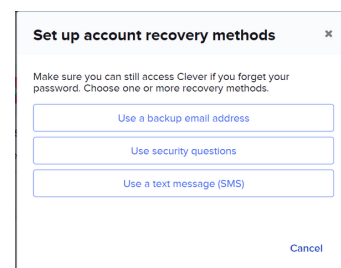
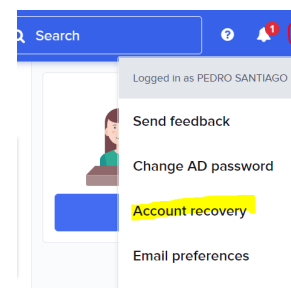
Account Recovery:
