Cambridge Program Selection

Generally, students entering the Cambridge program have an overall grade point average of 3.0 or higher and a level 4 or 5 on the FSA Reading and Math. Students may work towards the AICE Diploma or take individual courses. Colleges award credit on a subject-by-subject basis.

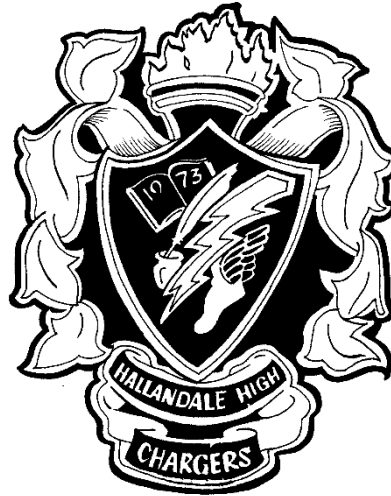
Comparison Between AICE, AP, and IB

The Cambridge AICE Program

(Advanced International Certificate of Education)

The Cambridge International Program, part of the University of Cambridge, prepares students for college and careers by offering a rigorous curriculum that is recognized internationally, preparing them for post-secondary coursework, and allowing the opportunity for students to earn college credits while in high school. The Cambridge Advanced International Certificate of Education (AICE) courses also allow our students the opportunity to earn the AICE Diploma, which is recognized and renowned by colleges and universities worldwide.

Characteristics of Cambridge Students

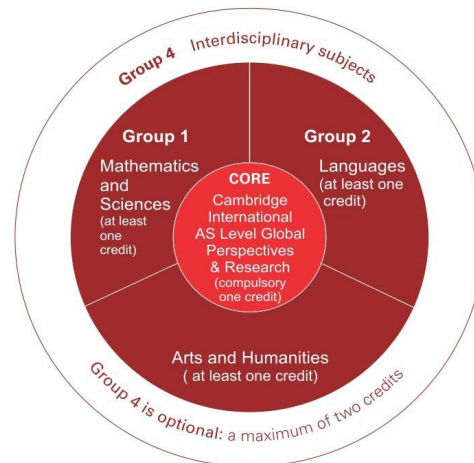
- **Confident** in working with information and ideas in their own and those of others

Benefits for Students

- Earn college credits for every exam passed, which are accepted by all Florida public universities and colleges; up to 45 total credits.
- Earn the internationally recognized AICE Diploma, which, along with the completion of 100 service hours, guarantees the highest level of the Bright Futures Scholarship equivalent to 100% tuition.
- Earn two quality points on their local high school grade point average (GPA).

The AICE Diploma

The Cambridge AICE Diploma is a group certificate which requires learners to study subjects drawn from three curriculum areas within Cambridge International AS & A Level: mathematics and science, languages, and arts and humanities. There is also a compulsory core subject, Cambridge International AS Level Global Perspectives & Research. A total of seven credits are required for the diploma.



Total of seven credits required for Diploma

Cambridge International AS Level = one credit

Cambridge International A Level = two credits

Learners can accumulate credits for the Diploma over a 25-month period.
