Cambridge Program Selection

Students typically enter the Cambridge program with an overall GPA of 3.0 or higher and a level 4 or 5 on the FAST ELA and Math assessments. They can work towards the AICE Diploma or take individual courses. Colleges award credit on a subject-by-subject basis.

University Course Equivalents

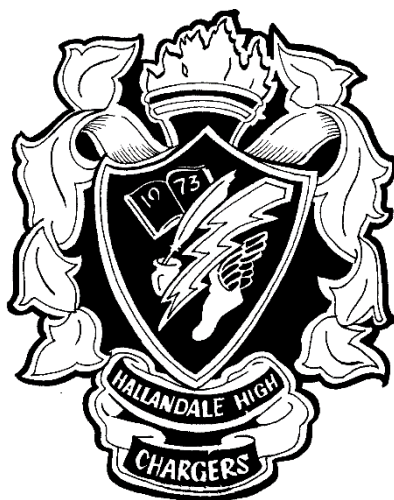
Comparison Between AICE, AP, and IB

The Cambridge AICE Program (Advanced International Certificate of Education)

The Cambridge International Program, part of the University of Cambridge, prepares students for college and careers by offering a rigorous curriculum that is recognized internationally, preparing them for post-secondary coursework, and allowing the opportunity for students to earn college credits while in high school. The Cambridge Advanced International Certificate of Education (AICE) courses also allow our students the opportunity to earn the AICE Diploma, which is recognized and renowned by colleges and universities worldwide.

Characteristics of Cambridge Students

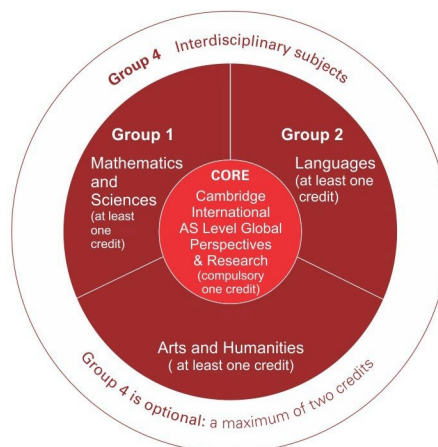
- **Confident** in working with information and ideas in their own and those of others.

Benefits for Students

- Gain college credits for each exam passed, accepted by all Florida public universities and colleges, up to a total of 45 credits.
- Achieve the internationally recognized AICE Diploma, which, coupled with the fulfillment of 100 service hours, ensures eligibility for the highest level of the Bright Futures Scholarship, covering 100% of tuition.
- Receive an additional two quality points on their local high school grade point average (GPA).

The AICE Diploma

The Cambridge AICE Diploma is a group certificate that mandates students to delve into subjects from three curriculum categories within Cambridge International AS & A Level: mathematics and science, languages, and arts and humanities. Additionally, students must undertake a mandatory core subject, Cambridge International AS Level Global Perspectives & Research. To earn the diploma, students must accumulate a total of seven credits.



Total of seven credits required for Diploma

Cambridge International AS Level = one credit

Cambridge International A Level = two credits

Learners can accumulate credits for the Diploma over a 25-month period.
