

Cambridge International AS & A Level — International Curriculum

- Students develop deep subject knowledge, conceptual understanding and higher order thinking skills.
- They learn the skills needed for life and to achieve at school, university and work
- Flexibility of study students can choose from various subjects
- Students may earn college credit if they pass an end of the year AICE exam with an A, B, C, D, or E.
- ALL Florida state schools give college credit for passed AICE examinations.
- Students earning a C or above in the course will get 2 additional quality points averaged in their GPA, similar to AP courses.



Additional AICE Information




- Students can take AP and AICE classes simultaneously
- Students that earn an AICE Diploma by the end of 11th Grade can waive HOPE (Physical Education) and an Online Class.
- Students may earn an AICE Diploma if 7 courses are taken with at least one in each category in 24 months (3 school years) from your first exam.
- Students that earn an <u>AICE DIPLOMA</u> qualify for highest level of Bright Futures w/ 100 service hours with the Cambridge Diploma without SAT or ACT minimum scores!



AICE Diploma Requirements

Students must earn 7 credits by passing a combination of exams at the AS level (1 credit) or A level (2 credits) in a <u>25-month period starting in June of the year of their first exam</u>. A minimum of one exam must come from each of the 3 subject areas:

- Mathematics & Science
- Language Arts (Includes Foreign Languages)
- Arts & Humanities






All AICE Diploma Students must take Global Perspectives AS


- Students must earn at least 7 points in 3 school years.



CAMBRIDGE DIPLOMA NIGHT



The Advanced International Certificate of Education program (AICE)

is an innovative and accelerated method of academic study offered solely through the University of Cambridge International Examination. In this program, students take Advanced International Certificate of Education (AICE) 9-12 courses and can earn an international diploma if they accrue at least 7 points by passing AICE exams within a three-year period (25 months from the first exam to the last exam). Students must take a class in each of the three groups, math and science, languages, arts, humanities and Global Perspective.



Flexible, broad and balanced:

By demanding knowledge from three different subject groups, the Cambridge AICE Diploma provides a broad curriculum with a balance of math and science, languages, arts and humanities. It still maintains flexibility and choice by allowing students to pick specific subjects and levels.

General Questions:

A Cambridge diploma guarantees a Bright Future ACADEMIC tuition scholarship, the highest Bright Futures awards possible, without having to meet some other requirements such as ACT/SAT scores.

Students can have any combinations of regular, honors, AICE, or AP courses.

University of Cambridge International Examinations publishes a list on its website of US universities that have provided written statements of their AICE (which includes AS and A Levels) recognition policy. Go to www.cie.org.uk/ qualifications/recognition

EXAMS are offered in November, May and June (they may occur after school is out).
