Two Types of Academic Programs

Similarities and Differences

 CollegeBoard

AP[®]

- Endorsed by College Board (SAT Creators)
 - Well-established in USA
- Exams within school year

Both

- 2 Quality points toward local GPA
- Possible credit by exam – equally accepted by Florida schools
- Both advanced and rigorous
- Must take exams to earn quality points towards local GPA



Cambridge Assessment International Education

- Offered by University of Cambridge
- Internationally recognized program
- Cambridge Diploma option
- Florida Academic Scholars Award without SAT/ACT scores
- Exams could be outside of school year
- No make-up exams





AP AND AICE GENERAL INFORMATION

- **Students can take AP and AICE classes simultaneously.**
- **Students earn 2 quality points on GPA for AP and AICE Classes.**
- **Students may earn college credit if AICE or AP exams are passed.**

Differences with AICE Program:

- **Students may earn an AICE Diploma**
- **Students earning an AICE Diploma, and 100 community service hours will qualify for Bright Futures - Florida Academic Scholar Award w/out qualifying SAT/ACT scores.**
- **Students can exempt HOPE and online graduation requirement with the completion of the AICE curriculum.**



AICE Diploma Requirements

Students must earn 7 credits by passing a combination of exams at the AS level (1 credit) or A level (1 credit) in a 25-month period starting in June of the year of their first exam. The ONLY A level course offered for 2 credits is Thinking Skills. A minimum of one exam must come from each of the 3 subject areas:

- Mathematics & Science
- Language Arts (Includes Foreign Languages)
- Arts & Humanities



****All AICE Diploma Students must take Global Perspectives AS****

****Students do not have to earn an AICE diploma to receive college credit****

****AICE Diplomas of Distinction or Merit are based on AICE Exam scores****



CAMBRIDGE AICE DIPLOMA SUBJECT GROUPS AND CORE

REQUIRED: AS LEVEL GLOBAL PERSPECTIVES AND RESEARCH (COMPONENTS 1,2, & 3)

TO EARN the DIPLOMA:

- **Students must earn at least 7 points in 3 school years.**
- **One Course from Groups 1 thru 3 AND Global Perspectives and 100 Community Service Hours.**

The Advanced International Certificate of Education program (AICE)

is an innovative and accelerated method of academic study offered solely through the University of Cambridge International Examination. In this program, students take Advanced International Certificate of Education (AICE) 9-12 courses and can earn an international diploma if they accrue at least 7 points by passing AICE exams within a three-year period (25 months from the first exam to the last exam). Students must take a class in each of the three groups, math and science, languages, arts, humanities and Global Perspective.

Flexible, broad and balanced:

By demanding knowledge from three different subject groups, the Cambridge AICE Diploma provides a broad curriculum with a balance of math and science, languages, arts and humanities. It still maintains flexibility and choice by allowing students to pick specific subjects and levels.

General Questions:

A Cambridge diploma guarantees a Bright Future ACADEMIC tuition scholarship, the highest Bright Futures awards possible, without having to meet some other requirements such as ACT/SAT scores.

Students can have any combinations of regular, honors, AICE, or AP courses.

University of Cambridge International Examinations publishes a list on its website of US universities that have provided written statements of their AICE (which includes AS and A Levels) recognition policy. Go to www.cie.org.uk/qualifications/recognition

EXAMS are offered in November, May and June (they may occur after school is out).

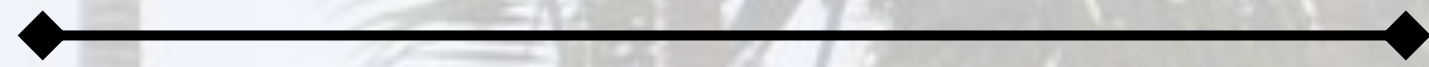
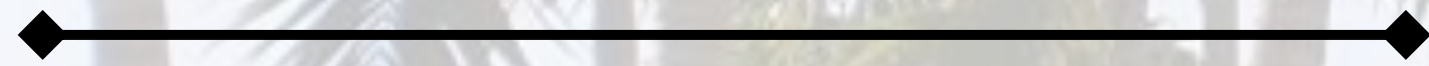



CHART A NEW PATH
