




- 1. Apply as a Dual Enrollment student at Broward College get ID and email.



## Highschool/College Graduation Requirements

- 24 Total Credits
- 4 English (high school and college English classes count)
- 4 Math (Alg. Geom. Alg. 2 and a class above Alg. 2, college math's count)
- 3 Science including Biology (MUCH stronger if you have 4 our students will have 4)
- 3 Social Studies (World History, American History, American Gov./Econ (our students will have 4)
- New Requirement: Financial Literacy course and Take Civics
  Assessment
- World Language (2 years of the same world language required for 4year university). Many private and out of state institutions want 3 years.

## Highschool/College Graduation Requirements (cont.)

- Performing/practical art (Debate, AP Art History, some DE Classes)
- PE (HLP and fitness lifestyle design or HOPE) HLP college course mandated for AA degree counts as Pers. Fit.
- Testing (Algebra EOC, 10th grade FSA ELA)
- Online class (via FLVS and/or Dual Enrollment)
- Appropriate behavior!
- Community Service (100 Bright Futures, 250 Silver Cord)
- 3.0 GPA for MCA
- College AA requirements (60 total credits, 36 specific)

#### **Dual Enrollment**


- MUST keep a 3.0 unweighted GPA to take a dual enrollment class
- Must have passed all 3 sections of the ACCUPLACER to do dual enrollment and usually require a retake end of 10<sup>th</sup> grade
- Must earn an A, B or C in the dual enrollment class to continue in program
- AA requirements will be worked on in DE classes
- Junior year half day high school, half day college
- Senior year full time college
- 60 total credits


#### **Broward College**

- Broward College meets with our Juniors and Seniors
- MCA will provide you with a Prescribed Plan of Study. This "plan" assists students in ensuring that they meet both high school graduation and AA college degree
- We are in communication with Dual Enrollment professors, however grades and attendance cannot be monitored by MCA Counselors, so students <u>must</u> study and turn in all assignments on time
