Moreover, the school has been recognized by Broward County Public Schools for its 99% graduation rate – one of the highest in the county – and by the state of Florida for the 5-Star School Award. CCHS has 2340 students, grades 9 through 12, with a culturally diverse population: 46% White, 34% Hispanic/Latino, 12% Black, 4% Asian and 4% Multi-racial or Other. Cooper City High School offers 24 Advanced Placement classes as well as 46 honors classes, in addition to the AICE Cambridge Program, which began this year. Advanced Placement and Dual Enrollment

In 2019, 558 CCHS students took over 1346 AP tests in 24 subjects, and 62% scored 3 or higher. Also, 12 students received an AP Capstone Diploma. In 2019, 219 students took Dual Enrollment courses and 21 students were Early Admission students at Broward College, Florida Atlantic University and University of Florida.
