Silver Lakes Middle Dolphins continue to leap out and propel our math scores upward. The PM 2 (Progress Monitoring Math 2) scores indicate that 46% of our students are at or approaching mastery.

Kudos to our math teachers who are dedicated to our ELO after-school program, pull-in, and push and tutoring programs. The Savvas curriculum and SuccessMaker programs are designed with core math instruction. SuccessMaker provides our students with continuous adaptive math instruction. It is personalized math learning that is unique to every student.

In 2024, our math students will continue to participate in our ST Math program using counting and numbers and circles blocking JiJi, the penguin, from crossing the path. Digital puzzles and games are used to teach our students math skills.



Over the past few weeks, our students have been actively engaged in various activities and assignments, making significant strides in their reading skills.

We are pleased to inform you that our students have successfully completed their Unit One test. This assessment aimed to evaluate their comprehension, vocabulary, and critical thinking skills developed throughout the unit. We have witnessed remarkable growth in their ability to analyze texts, evaluate arguments, and draw connections between different ideas. We are incredibly proud of their hard work and dedication to their studies.

Currently, our students are embarking on a new writing challenge: an argumentative essay. The upcoming weeks will be dedicated to understanding the elements of persuasive writing, constructing logical arguments, and presenting their viewpoints effectively.
