

Important Update For K-12 Students WIRELESS DEVICE POLICY





WIRELESS DEVICE USE NOT ALLOWED DURING SCHOOL DAY

Effective in the 2024/25 School Year



All wireless devices must be powered off or in airplane mode during the school day, from bell to bell, including passing periods and lunch unless authorized for instructional purposes.



Wireless devices include cellphones, laptops, smartwatches, tablets, headphones, airpods, and other two-way communication equipment.



Students violating policy are subject to disciplinary action.

Safety & Security DETECTION

Starting on the first day of school, August 12, 2024, all students and visitors entering BCPS high schools must pass through metal detectors monitored by security personnel and school staff.

The District asks parents and families to support this initiative by ensuring that students are aware of the system and prepared to follow new procedures.

Beginning this year,

- High school entry points have been consolidated to ensure all students are screened for weapons prior to entering the school.
- Students must wear their IDs to pass through the detectors. They can carry their backpacks or bags and will not need to empty pockets or remove shoes, cellphones, keys, metal on clothes or belts as those items will not alert the system.
- Some items will result in an alert and must be placed on adjacent tables to be screened by security staff. These include laptops, large eyeglass cases, musical instruments, umbrellas and 3-ring binders. These items can be collected once students are cleared for entry.
- Students who alert the system when passing through the metal detectors will be screened separately. School staff will be available to support them during this process.

This added security measure at high schools may result in slight delays at entry. Parents and students should plan accordingly. Please allow extra time for screening and ensure your student does not bring weapons or other prohibited items to school. While the metal detectors will only be used in our high schools at this time, it is important that parents of students in all grades are aware of what their students bring to school and remind them that prohibited items are never permitted on campus.

The support of our parents, students and families is essential to keeping our schools safe and secure. Thank you for doing your part to ensure a successful rollout of the metal detection system at our high schools. Arrival & Dismissmal



Student card riders should be dropped off and picked up at the car loops on Dragon Way (5th Place) only. Students will enter campus through our Auditorium Lobby single point entrance and must have their Student ID visibly displayed around their necks. Students are expected to be seated in their 1st or 5th period classroom by 7:40AM anyone arriving to campus after 7:40AM is considered tardy and will face consequences in alignment with the Broward County's Student Code of Conduct.

The Code Book for Students Conduct & Discipline Materix

The Code of Student Conduct, Policy 5.8, provides specific information regarding the rules that all students are expected to adhere to, as well as consequences for violations. Important among these rules are consistent and timely attendance, respect for people and property, appropriate dress, technology usage, student publications, student activities, student records and the right to appeal, including grievance procedures. The School Board of Broward County, Florida, approves and affirms its support of the Code of Student Conduct, Policy 5.8.

Tardy Policy



- First Offence: Will serve as a warning and will be used to inform students that they must be in class prior to the second bell.
- Second Offence: Student will be issued a second final warning.
- Third Offence: Student will be issued an after-school detention.
- Fourth Offence: Student will stay in Internal Suspension for the remainder of the block.
- Fifth Offence: Student will be assigned (1) day of Saturday school or 1 day of Internal Suspension.

Dress Code Policy



- Revealing clothing or clothing that exposes the torso is not allowed.
- Clothing which is not worn properly or has tears that are indecent will not be permitted. All trousers must be secured at the waist.
- Garments which were traditionally designed as undergarments, sleepwear or beachwear may not be worn as outer garments.
- Leggings without overblouses (long shirts) will not be allowed.

Students have the right to wear stylish clothes of their choice as long as those clothes are appropriate for school and are not dangerous to health and safety and do not create a substantial disruption of the school.





Students must wear a Stranahan High School Student Identification Badge (Student ID) at all times while on campus.

- 1. Student ID must be visible and not in book bags, pockets or under clothing.
- 2. The Student ID must be replaced when lost or damaged beyond recognition.
- 3. Students must request a new Student ID from the Media Clerk and pay \$5.00 to be issued a new permanent ID. If a student is unable to pay an obligation will be created for them.
- 4. Temporary Student IDs: In the event students forget their identification badge, they will be provided with a temporary ID badge.
- 5. When the fifth request for a temporary badge is received, the student MUST purchase a new, permanent identification badge at a cost of \$5.00.

Please note student ID badges must be used to purchase breakfast/lunch.

Student Parking

Students who are eligible to drive to school will need to purchase a Student Parking Decal in order to park in the designated parking area. Decals can be purchased for \$60.00 from Mr. Fanfan, Security Specialist.

Drivers must provide the following documentation:

- 1. Valid Driver's License
- 2. Registration
- 3. Proof of current car insurance


Rider Registration

- All eligible students needing bus transportation for the upcoming school year must register for a bus assignment. Use <u>Add a subheading</u> to register and guarantee a bus assignment for the first day of school.
- Any student who registered for a bus last year and did not use the service, must register for a bus using their student 06 account.
- Eligible students must be registered by June 28, 2024, to reserve a bus seat for the first day of school on Monday, August 12.

NOTE: Transportation registration processes for programs such as ESE, 504, Foster, Homeless, and Teen Parent has not changed and will continue.

*Unregistered students waiting at a bus stop without a parent/guardian present, will be transported to school and turned over to an administrator. Unregistered students will not be transported home after school. This will be the responsibility of the parent/guardian.


