### I-Ready Reading Diagnostic January 11-29, 2021

The *I-Ready Reading Diagnostic* is an adaptive assessment that adjusts its questions to suit your child's needs. Each item a student receives is based on their answer to the previous question. For example, a series of correct answers will result in slightly harder questions, while a series of incorrect answers will yield slightly easier ones. The purpose of this is not to give your child a score or grade but to determine how to best support their learning.

### What can I do to help?

To help prepare your child for the I-Ready Reading Diagnostic, encourage them to:

- Get a good night's sleep and eat a full breakfast the day of the assessment.
- Try their best on each question and try not to rush.
- Try not to worry about questions they do not know—remind them that it is expected they will only get about half of the questions correct.
- Be respectful of other students who take longer to finish.



### To support your child's learning in I-Ready, you can:

- Discuss your child's progress on their I-Ready lessons.
- Celebrate your child's learning and growth.
- Encourage them to use I-Ready at home.
  - They will need access to a computer or iPad, internet, and their login information. To check if your system meets I-Ready system requirements, please visit <u>i-Ready.com/Support</u> to run a system check.


