



#### The 20-20-20 Rule!

Have you ever noticed that when you sit in front of a computer for too long, your eyes seem to dry out and get tired? That is because you don't blink as often when looking at a screen. To promote healthy eyes and perfect 20-20 vision, use the 20-20-20 rule when using electronic devices to prevent eye strain. Every 20 min., look at something 20 feet away for 20 seconds. This can be as simple as gazing out of a window at a lamp post. Another variation of this is to close your eyes for 20 seconds, every 20 min., and move your eyes around 20 times (while they are closed). This will re-lubricate your eyes and keep them feeling better.
