



- FAST refers to the new Progress Monitoring Assessments aligned to the BEST standards.
- VPK—Grade 10* ELA and Mathematics (not EOCs)
- Senate Bill 1048
 - Removes the requirement that grades 3–6 assessments be delivered in a paper-based format.
 - Replaces the current grade-level summative assessment system with the Coordinated Screening and Progress Monitoring System required in section <u>1008.25(8)</u>, F.S.
 - Because the new law requires ELA for grades 3–10, the new contract with CAI will be written to include grades 9 and 10 for ELA assessments.





- Cambium Assessment, Incorporated (CAI), partnered with Renaissance Learning, Incorporated (RL), has been selected as the primary vendor.
- For VPK—Grade 2, schools will use/administer RL's Star Early Literacy for VPK; and Star Early Literacy/Reading and Star Mathematics assessments for Grades K—2.
- For Grades 3–10, schools will administer assessments through TDS.



VPK-2 Assessments

- Star Early Literacy, Star Reading, and Star Mathematics
- Each test is administered in one session. It is recommended that each student take only one subject test in a day.
- All three attempts (PM1, PM2, PM3) are for progress monitoring purposes (no summative third attempt tied to accountability in the same way as Grades 3-10)
- Computer-adaptive through a secure web browser (headphones required)
- VPK assessment will be used as one component to calculate Kindergarten readiness rates



VPK-2 Assessments

- We are working with the Division of Early Learning regarding VPK implementation and oversight.

Grades 3-10

- NEW Reading and Mathematics assessments aligned to the B.E.S.T. Standards (NOT APM!)
- Each test is administered in one session. It is recommended that each student take only one subject test in a day.
- PM1 and PM2 are for progress monitoring purposes; PM3 is a summative assessment used for accountability purposes (2022-2023 baseline year; 2023-24 and beyond with new cut scores applied).
- Computer-adaptive through the Test Delivery System (TDS) secure browser.
