UNDERSTANDING MY REPORT



WHAT IS THE FLORIDA BRIGHT FUTURE SCHOLARSHIP?

- The Florida Bright Futures Scholarship Program establishes funded scholarships to reward Florida high school graduates for high academic achievement.
 - Money awarded by the state for Florida post secondary institutions to cover the cost of tuition (just the cost of classes).
- Recommended that ALL seniors apply during senior year (even if going out-of-state for college, think you will not qualify, or enlisting in the Military) Students can receive the scholarship award/funding for up to 5 years from high school graduation for a maximum of 120 semester hours (or equivalent) towards the completion of their first baccalaureate degree

FIVE ELIGIBILTY REQUIREMENTS NEEDED TO BE MET

(As determined by the Florida Department of Education)

- 1. Submit a complete Florida Financial Aid Application (FFAA), a.k.a. the state application, during last year of high school (Deadline: August 31, 2023), at https://www.FloridaStudentFinancialAidsg.org.
- 2. Complete ALL required coursework by high school graduation, including the 16 college-preparatory courses required for admission to a state university.
- 3. Achieve the required grades and weighted grade point average (GPA) in the 16 college-preparatory courses.
- 4. Achieve the required college entrance exam score (composite ACT; combined SAT; etc.).
 - No later than June 30, 2023. Note: Early Evaluation testing cutoff date January 31, 2023.
 - A student graduating early and seeking spring funding must submit FFAA by December 31 of their graduating year. There is no exception to this application deadline.
- Complete the required number of community volunteer service or paid work hours by high school graduation.

ADDITIONAL ELIGIBILTY REQUIREMENTS

- Cambridge (AICE); International Baccalaureate (IB); etc.] OR by a non-traditional method (enrolled in a Home Education Program; received a Florida GED diploma; or received a high school diploma from a non-Florida school while living with a parent or guardian who is on A) military or B) public service assignment away from Florida.
- Must apply before graduation in senior year.
 - Students who meet all academic requirements, but do not apply, will not be eligible for the scholarship in the future.
- Must request their official single sitting test scores be sent to at least one of (12) Florida's state public universities.
- Pursue an undergraduate degree at an eligible Florida college or enroll in a postsecondary adult yocational certificate program.
 - Enroll for at least six nonremedial semester hours (or the equivalent in quarter or clock hours) per term
- Begin using the scholarship funds within five years of high school graduation.
 - A student who is receiving a Florida Bright Futures Scholarship and discontinues his/her education to enlist in the United States Armed Forces must commence the remainder of the renewal period upon the date of separation from active duty
- Be a Florida resident and a U.S. citizen or eligible non-citizen, as determined by your postsecondary institution.
 - Not be found guilty of, or plead no contest to, a felony charge.

NOTIFICATION OF ELIGIBILITY

- Eligibility determination status, with the award status notification will be posted to the student's online Financial Aid Recipient History (FARH) screen.
- Early Evaluations (7th Semester) –Postings may begin in March
 - Official early evaluation (based on academic progress in the middle of the last year of high school and test scores for tests taken no later than January 31)
- Final Evaluations (8th Semester) –Postings may begin in July
 - Submitted following the student's last term in high school (with test scores for tests taken no later than June 30th)
- ► NOTE: Students awarded an IB or AICE Diploma will receive notifications of eligibility determination in early fall after a list of IB and AICE Diploma recipients has been received from these respective organizations.

HIGH SCHOOL COLLEGE-PREPARATORY COURSES FOR FLORIDA STATE UNIVERSITY (SUS) ELIGIBILITY

- English (4 credits)
 - 3 of 4 credits must include substantial writing)
- Math (4 credits)
 - at or above Algebra 1 level
 - Algebra 1; Geometry, and Algebra 2 (or a series of courses equivalent to Algebra 2)
- Natural Science (3 credits)
 - Biology 2 of 3 must have substantial laboratory (including Biology I or equivalent)
- Social Studies (3 credits)
 - World History; U.S. History; U.S. Government; and Economics (or equivalent of each)
- World Language (2 credits)
 - Sequential, in same language

WEIGHTED GRADE POINT AVERAGE (GPA)

- The Bright Futures grade point average (GPA) may differ from the GPA on the report card.
- A weighted scale is applied to college preparatory courses (Florida Academic Scholars, Florida Medallion Scholars, and Florida Gold Seal Vocational Scholars Awards).
- 0.5 additional quality point for each full credit and .25 additional quality point for each half-credit is awarded for courses that are more challenging.
- An unweighted scale is applied to career preparatory courses (Florida Gold Seal Vocational Scholars Award).
- Local Honors courses do not receive additional quality points. Also, the (+) grade is not recognized by Bright Futures.

FOUR LEVELS OF BRIGHT FUTURES SCHOLARSHIP AWARDS

- Each level can be awarded with different eligibility criteria:
 - Florida Academic Scholars (FAS)
 - Includes Academic Top Scholars award (ATS)
 - Florida Medallion Scholars (FMS)
 - Florida Gold Seal CAPE Scholars (GSC)
 - ► Florida Gold Seal Vocational Scholars (GSV)

Florida Academic Scholars Award (FAS)

Covers:

- 100% Scholarship Coverage of Tuition and Applicable Fees
 - Applicable fees include: activity and service fee, health fee, athletic fee, financial aid fee, capital improvement fee, campus access/transportation fee, technology fee and tuition differential fee.
- ► \$300 stipend for both fall and spring semesters for additional educational expenses
- Students attending a public institution will have tuition and applicable fees covered. Students attending a nonpublic institution will receive a comparable amount as noted in the Private Award Chart.
- FAS students can receive an award during the summer sessions to cover tuition and applicable fees.
- ► High School Weighted Bright Futures GPA: 3.50

 - Must earn either the required volunteer service or paid work hours, but not a combination of both.

ACADEMIC TOP SCHOLARS

A disbursed FAS student in each district is awarded an additional per credit hour award for fall and spring. FAS students who attend in the fall following high school graduation are ranked on the product of their Bright Futures weighted GPA and their best college entrance exam score.

Florida Medallion Scholars Award (FMS)

Covers:

- 75% Scholarship Coverage of Tuition and Applicable Fees
 - Applicable fees include: activity and service fee, health fee, athletic fee, financial aid fee, capital improvement fee, campus access/transportation fee, technology fee and tuition differential fee.
- Students attending a public institution will have tuition and applicable fees covered. Students attending a nonpublic institution will receive a comparable amount as noted in the Private
 Award Chart.
- FMS students can receive an award during the summer sessions to cover tuition and applicable fees. B
- Beginning in fall 2021, FMS students enrolled in an associate degree program at a Florida College System institution will receive 100% of tuition and specific fees.

- Community Service Hours: 75 Community Service or PAID Work-Based Hours: 100
 - Must earn either the required volunteer service or paid work hours, but not a combination of both.

Florida Gold Seal Vocational Scholars (GSV) / Florida Gold Seal CAPE Scholars (GSC)

- Gold Seal awards (GSC/GSV) may only be used at postsecondary institutions that offer an applied technology diploma, technical degree education program (associate in science-A.S. or associate in applied science-A.A.S.), or a career certificate program.
- Award recipients will receive a fixed cost per credit hour based on award level, institution type, and credit type as outlined in the table below

Florida Gold Seal Vocational Scholars (GSV)

- May be funded if a student is enrolled in a career education or certificate program. Florida high school students who wish to qualify for the
- GSV award must meet the following initial eligibility requirements:
 - Achieve the required weighted minimum 3.0 GPA in the non-elective high school courses.
 - Take at least 3 full credits in a single Career and Technical Education program.
 - Achieve the required minimum 3.5 unweighted GPA in the career education courses.
 - Complete 30 volunteer service OR 100 paid work hours.
 - Achieve the required minimum score on the ACT, SAT or Florida Postsecondary Education Readiness Test (P.E.R.T.) exams (see next slide).

- Achieve the required minimum scores on one of the college entrance exams per the chart below no later than June 30 of the year the student graduates from high school.
 - Scholarship Restrictions:
 - The GSV award may only be used at postsecondary institutions that offer an applied technology diploma, technical degree education program (associate in applied science or associate in science), or a career certificate program and not towards the completion of an associate in arts or a baccalaureate degree.

Florida Gold Seal CAPE Scholars (GSC)

- The Florida Gold Seal CAPE Scholars award (GSC) may be funded if a student is enrolled in a career education or certificate program. Upon completion of an associate in science degree program that articulates to a Bachelor of Science degree, a GSC Scholar may also receive an award for a maximum of 60 credit hours toward a Bachelor of Science degree program. Upon completion of an associate in applied science program, a GSC Scholar may also receive an award for a maximum of 60 credit hours toward a bachelor of applied science degree program.
- Florida high school students who wish to qualify for the GSC award must meet the following initial eligibility requirements:
 - Earn a minimum of five (5) postsecondary credit hours through CAPE industry certifications that articulate for college credit; and
 - Complete at least 30 volunteer service or 100 paid work hours.

- \$cholarship Restrictions:
 - Until a student has earned an eligible associate degree, Gold Seal CAPE (GSC) scholarships may only be used at postsecondary institutions that offer an applied technology diploma, technical degree education program (associate in applied science or associate in science), or a career certificate program.
 - Upon completion of an eligible associate degree program, a GSC Scholar may also receive an award for a maximum of 60 credit hours toward an eligible baccalaureate degree.

OTHER WAYS TO QUALIFY

Students who have demonstrated academic merit through a recognition program may be eligible for Bright Futures without having to meet one or more of the requirements. Note: Both AICE and IB Diplomas must be earned prior to high school graduation. Confirmations may come from AICE and IB as late as September. Please refer to the table below for how to qualify based on one of the merit recognition programs.

AICE Curriculum

- Complete a minimum of 14 AICE credits* identified by the Cambridge Assessment International Education (Cambridge International) in the Diploma Core and three academic areas as follows:
 - AICE Diploma Core AICE Global Perspectives & Research AS level (Two Credits required)
 - Group / Mathematics and Sciences (Two Credits required)
 - Group 2 Languages (Two Credits required)
 - → Group 3 Arts and Humanities (Two Credits required) o
 - Froup 4 Interdisciplinary Skills (Optional Four Credits maximum)
 - Six additional credits required in any combination from the above four groups.

"Students earn one credit by completing and passing one AICE full credit course and another credit for taking the corresponding AICE examination.

IB Curriculum

- Complete a minimum of 10 credits identified by the International Baccalaureate Organization:
 - Two credits each in three of the following areas and one credit each in the remaining three areas: Language Arts, World Language, Social Studies, Science, Mathematics and Arts/Electives. Each of these credits must be an IB or AP course. Pre-IB courses do not meet IB curriculum requirements.
 - One credit in Theory of Knowledge
- Complete the Creativity, Action, Service (CAS) requirement
- Complete an extended essay.

Volunteer/Community Service-Learning Hours

Service Learning/Volunteer Service must:

- Provide services to meet the needs to both their school and community.
- Be coordinated with a school or community service program and with the community.
- Teach the skills of civil participation and develop an unequaled standard of service and civic responsibility.
- Be on a voluntary basis to public, nonprofit agencies, civic, charitable and governmental organizations and school campus.
- All service/work hours must be reported on the transcript.

Service Learning and Volunteer Service Program is divided into three tiers:

- Tier I 40 Hours Service Learning Hours required for graduation.
- Tier II <u>75 Hours (FMS) / 100 Hours (FAS)</u> Service hours required to meet the Bright Futures Initial Eligibility Requirements.
- Tier III 250 Hours Volunteer Service Hours required earn a silver cord at graduation.

Service Learning and Volunteer Service Program Tiers

■ What does and doesn't count!

- Volunteer hours may be earned within the school, community or for any non-profit or charitable organization.
- Students may not perform hours for any "for profit" businesses such as doctors, attorneys, stores, or restaurants.
- Hours do not count if you have been financially compensated.
- Time out of class may not be used for service hours.
- A parent or fellow student cannot sign off on service hours performed.
- Service hours performed as a result of disciplinary action for the school or courts do not count.
- Hours do not count at for-profit summer camps.
- Does not include waived hours

Paid Work Hours for Bright Futures

- The paid work hours' form is for students to use when documenting work hours.
 - These are for Bright Futures Purposes ONLY. They cannot be used for graduation required community service nor the Silver Cord.
 - The paid work hours must have occurred on July 1, 2022 and after, since this is when the state statute went into effect.
 - ALL Bright Futures awards require 100 paid work hours, regardless of the amount of community service required. (i.e. for the Medallion (FMS/75%) they need 75 service hours OR 100 paid work hours)
 - You cannot mix and match community service and paid work.

Where to turn in Service-Learning Hours documents?


- ALL original copies of the Service-Learning Hours documents should be turned into your grade level School Counselor to be added to the student's transcript.
 - ► MUST be submitted by the last day of school EACH year.
- A Student Volunteer Service Application and Approval Form will need to be turned in and approved for each community organization. Approval will be needed before volunteer hours can be counted.
- Always make a copy of all documents for yourself before turning them in.
- Please see your grade-level school counselor if you have questions or concerns about Service-Learning Hours.

Scholarship Restrictions/Limitations

- All hours are paid at the undergraduate level.
- No remedial course work is funded.

Dropping or Withdrawing from Course(s) after Drop/Add

- A student must reimburse the postsecondary institution for the cost of course(s) dropped or withdrawn after the initial drop/add period. The student will not be eligible to renew his/her Bright Futures award for any subsequent academic year until repayment or a satisfactory arrangement to reimburse the institution is made. After repayment, those hours are returned to the student's hours remaining for funding purposes.
- Due to verifiable illness or emergency, a student may make an appeal to the home postsecondary institution for hours dropped or withdrawn after the last day of the drop/add period.






