- 4. **Be a tourist in your own town.** Often people only explore attractions on trips, but you may be surprised what cool things are in your backyard.
- 5. Try prepping your lunches or picking out your clothes for the work week. You'll save some time in the mornings and have a sense of control about the week ahead.
- 6. Work some omega-3 fatty acids into your diet—they are linked to decreased rates of depression and schizophrenia among their many benefits. Fish oil supplements work,but eating your omega-3s in foods like wild salmon, flaxseeds or walnuts also helps build healthy gut bacteria.

FINAL EXAM EXEMPTION PROCESS

Final exams for students in grades 9-11 are scheduled for June 5-10. Students will take two exams each day and follow a modified early release bell schedule. Additionally, students are allowed to exempt up to three qualifying courses. Please review the exam schedule and exemption criteria below and click the link to access the exemption form.

Note: This form will close at 2:40 PM on Friday, May 31. Students will only be allowed one submission and must be logged into their Clever account.

EXEMPTION CRITERIA

As per School Board Policy 6000.1, a student may be exempt from the midterm and/or final exams in a high school course under the following criteria:

- (1) The student earns a grade of "B" or better in all marking periods of the respective high school course during the semester of the exemption.
- (2) The student may waive eligible midterms or final exams for up to one-half of all high school or higherlevel courses on the student's regular school day schedule.

- (3) Dual enrollment midterm and final exams may not be exempted.
- (4) The statewide, standardized EOC assessments, required by statute, are not eligible for exemption.
- (5) Midterm and/or final exams cannot be retroactively exempted once the student takes the exam.

Please choose your exam exemptions wisely. If you have chosen to exempt an exam, but your current quarter grade falls below a "B", it is your responsibility to then study for and be present for the exam. You would no longer be able to exempt the exam. You will NOT be able to replace this exam exemption with another class. It is the responsibility of the student to:

- 1) Obtain Teacher, Parent and Student e-signatures on the Exam Exemption Form.
- 2) Submit the Exam Exemption Form by the date requested by your school.
- 3) Verify with each teacher that you are still approved to exempt his/her exam and that your grade for the current quarter has not fallen below a "B". Reminder, if your grade does fall below a "B", you must take the exam.

Alyssa's Alert is a mobile duress alert application that empowers staff members to immediately notify first responders in the event of an emergency. Receive potentially life-saving aid with the push of a button.

Speed Crisis Response

Upon activation*, local first responders & District personnel receive an immediate notification of the emergency.

Easy to Use

Select one of the three buttons (shown right) to activate Alyssa's Alert. Assistance will immediately be dispatched to your location.**

Administrators will be able to push important updates regarding an emergency situation to anyone who has downloaded Alyssa's Alert.
