SCHOOL COUNSELING UPDATES

DUAL ENROLLMENT

Broward College is offering Dual Enrollment for the Spring term for students in grades 9 - 12th that have an unweighted GPA of a 3.0 of higher.

To qualify, students must also pass the ACCUPLACER Exam or have a qualified SAT/ACT score. The deadline for all testing and paperwork is due on October 5th. Please visit the CANVAS Gator-Aide page and our school's website for more information. Students can make an appointment with their School Counselor by stopping by the School Counseling Office before school or during lunch time, for an appointment pass.



BRACE REMINDERS

- The FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) and the FFAA (Florida Financial Aid Application) become available on October 1st for 12th grade students.
- It is time for seniors to work on completing their college applications. Remember to visit each institution's website for important deadlines and application process.



- Several state universities have a deadline of November 1 except for Florida State University which is October 15.
- Seniors are encouraged to create a Common App account by visiting https://www.commonapp.org/where students can apply to multiple institutions through this one account.

















SAFETY & SECURITY

REMINDERS

- Students and Staff must ALWAYS wear their IDs while on campus.
- The first four temporary IDs will be provided FREE of charge after which students will be charged \$1 each. Replacement IDs will cost \$5 and a lanyard will be available for \$2.
- Dress for Success! Egregious violations of the policy will be addressed by school administration. In the event of a violation, parents will be contacted to bring a change of clothing and/or the student will be provided with a school-issued garment. A \$5 obligation will be assessed.
- Food deliveries by outside companies (i.e. Uber Eats) are not allowed.

TARDY POLICY

- School starts at 7:40am.
- Please make sure to arrive at school before the start time.
- Administration and security will make every effort to guide students to class.
- Students that arrive late to school for 1st and 5th period will be marked tardy by the front office. These students will be issued a tardy pass and sent to class as soon as possible. For the remaining periods, a warning bell will ring one minute before the final bell to encourage students to get to class on time.
- Teachers will document tardy students in Pinnacle.
- Administration will pull a report each week and habitually tardy students (more than 5x/quarter) will receive progressive disciplinary consequences.
- Appropriate interventions, including detentions, parent contact, loss of privileges, etc. will be implemented to discourage chronic tardiness.
- Hall passes will not be issued the first or final 15-minutes of class. This includes Study Hall classes.
