### Reading Strategies

#### ANNOTATING TEXT

Annotate: Add notes to a text, giving explanation or comment

Purpose: This strategy will help students to improve their reading comprehension

#### Use the following strategies to annotate your article

- 1. Underline important text evidence.
  - a. Only underline the most important words and phrases
  - b. Do not underline entire paragraphs!
- 2. Circle words you do not know.
- 3. Highlight words and phrases you think are important.
- 4. Write notes and questions in the margins.
- 5. Sketch a picture to help you visualize a word or idea.

#### W.I.N. STRATEGY

Purpose: This strategy will help students to improve their reading comprehension skills.

Directions: Students will find the WIN for each section or paragraph from the text/article being read

**W-** Who or what is this passage or section about?

- I What is the most important information that you learned from this passage?
- N- In 5 words or less describe what is the main idea of the passage or the GIST.

## Writing Strategy: A.C.E.

**Purpose:** Helps students to organize their writing and support their thinking to form constructed responses.

- **A-** A topic sentence that answers a question
- **C-**Cite textual evidence to support the answer
- **E-**Explain how the textual evidence supports the answer
