

Cooper City High School Profile - Class of 2024

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School

Cooper City High School (CCHS) is a large suburban school located in Cooper City, Florida, and is accredited by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools. CCHS is a comprehensive public high school, designated Florida School of Excellence by the FLDOE, and nationally recognized as one of America's Best High Schools by *US News & World Report*. Moreover, the school has been recognized by Broward County Public Schools for its 99% graduation rate – one of the highest in the county. Of 543 graduates in the Class of 2024, 58% were Honor Grads, and 95% of seniors had college post-secondary plans. CCHS enrollment is 2429 students, grades 9 through 12, with a culturally diverse population: 42% White, 40% Hispanic/Latino, 6% Black, 7% Asian and 5% Multi-racial or Other. The total minority enrollment is 54%, and 33% of students are economically disadvantaged. Cooper City High School offers 25 Advanced Placement courses, 18 AICE Cambridge courses, 7 Pre-Advanced Courses and 63 Honors Courses. Students have earned Industry Certifications through Career and Technical Education courses: in the Class of 2024, 370 seniors graduated with nationally recognized industry certifications and 340 industry scholar diploma designations. Advanced Placement, AICE Cambridge and Dual Enrollment

The AP College Board recognized CCHS with the AP School Honor Roll with Access Award. In 2024, 1129 CCHS students took over 1,613 AP tests in 24 subjects, and 68% scored 3 or higher; 245 students were designated as AP Scholars. 21 students received an AP Capstone Diploma, and 87 students received AICE Cambridge Diploma. In 2024, 1184 CCHS students took over 2180 AICE Cambridge exams, with 78% passing their Cambridge Exam. In 2024, 264 students took Dual Enrollment courses at Broward College, University of Florida and Florida Atlantic University. At Broward College 11 students were Early Admission students.

Weighting of Grades

All subjects are given grades and credit. Grades in courses which are labeled Honors, Pre-AP AICE Cambridge, Advanced Placement or Dual Enrollment receive extra quality points when students earn a "C" or better. The school district determines class rank based upon the weighted GPA that is officially recalculated each semester.
