**For electives only:** You are required to select three alternate courses. Alternates are backup options that may be assigned if your first-choice courses are unavailable.

I understand that Pompano Beach High School is a **total magnet** high school and **all** students are required to participate in a **full** magnet program which includes a minimum of 4 credits of English, math, science, and social studies and 3 credits in sequence of the same modern world language and the same technology program. I also understand that **all** students are required to participate in a **full academic program** during all **four years** including **math and science**. This will ensure that all students at PBHS will have access to the requirements for the Scholar and Industry Diploma Designations. **ATTENDANCE** is mandatory for academic success and a pattern of non-attendance may result in a student **NOT** receiving credit for a course.

**Please note:** Students will not be permitted to drop AP courses after the College Board exam-ordering deadline in early November.

**LH = Local Honors:** The District has designated this course as “Local Honors” because it contains rigor that supports the awarding of an extra quality point towards the District’s weighted grade point average (GPA), which is used for class rank. These courses, however, may not be considered “honors” for State University Admissions, NCAA Eligibility, or for Bright Futures Scholarship purposes and may not be awarded the extra quality point in these programs’ recalculated GPAs. All local honors courses are designated with “LH” in the title.

**Opportunities for Dual Enrollment** are available through Broward College and the University of Florida.

**Personal Financial Literacy** is a new graduation requirement for students who entered 9th grade in school years 2021-2022 and After. PBHS students are encouraged to take this course on FLVS. This course is also offered through Dual Enrollment at Broward College.

#### Bright Futures Scholarship

The Florida Bright Future Scholarship program has awarded scholarships to thousands of Florida graduates. In order to qualify, students must make careful course selections each and every year of high school. When selecting courses for next year, consider the eligibility criteria for all three scholarships: the Florida Academic Scholars, the Florida Medallion Scholars, and the Florida Gold Seal Vocational Scholars.
