

It is that time of year!

High Stakes Tests and all the anxiety that comes along with it. Here are a few ways to help your child conquer test anxiety.

Text anxiety is real – validate their feelings and let them know that you understand. Make sure your child:

- *Eats a good breakfast if they eat at school make sure they are on time.
- *Goes to bed at a reasonable time the night before.
- *Give a motivational pep talk before they leave you and enter the school grounds.
- *Avoid social media.
- *Arrive to school on time.
- *Focus on the positive and encourage positive self-talk.
- *Help them to envision success (pro athletes' prep for a game).
- *Bolster confidence.
- *Debrief after tests ask your child how it went.

April is National Poetry Month!

Poetry Activities that can be done at home.

- RHYMING HUNT- this activity gets your children up and moving. This can be done
 inside the house, outdoors, and/or in the car. Ask your children to observe what's
 around them and allow them some time to come up with rhymes. For example, if you
 see a tree, allow your children to think of 3-5 words that rhyme with tree.
- USE SONG LYRICS music is one of the best ways to engage your children into
 any rhyming activity. A song becomes "catchy" because the lyrics flow. Have your
 children choose and analyze their favorite song. Ask: "Do they rhyme? What is the
 rhyming pattern? What makes the lyrics flow?"
- 3. WRITE A POEM- a free verse poem does not have to follow any rules. It just a way for your children to write their thoughts and feelings on paper. Color poetry is fun and engaging. This type of poem uses one specific color to convey the mood of the poet.
- 4. <u>BIO POEM</u>- these poems are filled with your children's emotions and personal thoughts. It allows your children to express themselves in writing. While this form of poetry does follow a specific pattern, the sentence starters of this form of poetry give students clear direction on how and what to write.
- ACROSTIC POEM- writing an acrostic poem can range from simple to challenging depending on your directions. Your children can write about their favorite toy, game, or family member.

Test Taking Skills for Parents

With the Florida State Assessment just around the corner, the Rock Island family is preparing for test success!! We have been hosting test taking workshops for Grades 3-5 every other Friday for the last few weeks to give the children tips and tools to take any test well. Here are a few strategies you can use at home with your scholars to add to their test taking toolbox.

- If you are anxious about your child's test, it's ok but try to keep cool around your child, you don't want them to get anxious about their tests too.
- Encourage your child to do well but don't pressure him/her. You may stress him/her out. It is important for your child to stay relaxed for the test.
- Mark down test days on your calendar so you and your child are both aware of testing dates.
- Make sure that your child gets enough sleep on the night before the test.
- Ensure that your child eats a healthy breakfast and avoid heavy foods that may make him/her groggy and avoid high sugar foods that may make him/her hyper.
- Make sure that your child gets up early enough so that he/she will be on time to school.

- Daily attendance is important for student success.
- Missing just 10% of school (about 18 days) can make learning to read difficult.
- Students who miss 10 days or more are 25% less likely to enroll in college.

Attendance Tips:

- Have a scheduled bedtime
- Set an alarm to wake up in the morning (school starts at 8:30)
- Be prepared (have clothes and supplies ready the night before)
- Absences may be reported on the school's website at browardschools.com/rockisland or by calling the attendance line at 754-322-8302
- Contact your school social worker and request assistance, if needed

2021-2022 Promotion Criteria

As we approach the fourth quarter of the 2021-2022 school year, teachers continue to analyze and assess student performance. **Report cards will be issued on April 18th.** Should your scholar's report card show "not meeting promotion criteria at this time", please contact your child's teacher to schedule a conference.

Broward County Schools Student Progression Plan (Policy 6000.1) outlines the criteria for student Promotion and Retention. The purpose of the Student Progression Plan is to establish the standards for quality instruction, delineate the criteria for promotion, provide equal educational opportunities to all students and ensure all students are college and career ready upon graduation. Below is a brief listing of the Student Progression Plan by grade level.
