# Principal's Message

Dear Parents and Community Members:

The school year is moving along quickly; we are halfway through the year! As we enter the winter holiday season, I hope that you and your family have time to reconnect and enjoy each other's company.

We are proud to have earned an "A" score at Dania Elementary School. We understand that this is a collaborative effort between, school, community, and families. To minimize the holiday "learning slump," I suggest you encourage your child(ren) to read and practice math fluency problems, such as simple addition, subtraction, multiplication and division facts. These areas are building blocks for a strong educational foundation. *iReady* is an online tool we purchased so that our students could practice and learn skills while at school AND AT HOME. This program allows students to practice reading and math online. I strongly encourage our students to use this valuable tool. Your child can sign-in the same way they do at school:

Historically, student attendance has dipped severely immediately after the winter

break. Students are scheduled to return to school January 8<sup>th</sup>, and I would like to see **every student** in school, on time, refreshed and ready to learn at 7:50 AM, Tuesday, January 8<sup>th</sup>! As we say to our students, "You have to be in it, to win it." Attendance is a critical component of effective continuous teaching and learning.

The Support Team and I have conducted Data Chat meetings with teachers. ## Pre-K and Kindergarten Updates

Kindergarten has been very busy these last few months! The students are working hard to identify all the letters and sounds. We are using the sounds to phonetically spell out words while writing. We also continue to practice how to write a sentence correctly using a capital letter at the beginning, spaces between words and punctuation at the end. We are starting to read and learn more sight words each week and continue practicing how to retell a story. We are training our students to be good listeners to identify the characters, name, and setting and sequence the events in a story. enjoyed the family projects the children brought in and the students loved showing their turkey feathers and gingerbread men to the class!

In math, we can recognize numbers and sets 0 to 10, identify two and three-dimensional shapes and identify how many sides and vertices shapes have. Now we are learning how to compare numbers to identify the same as, greater than, and less than. We will be learning addition and subtraction soon. Our students are practicing counting by 1's, 5's, and 10's to 100 as we prepare for the 100th day of school. In Science, we have enjoyed using our science skills and tools to observe, sort, compare, and measure. We learned about the life cycles of apples and pumpkins. We are currently studying gravity and the day and night sky. In Social Studies we had fun learning Thanksgiving. We learned how important our veterans are for their service to our country. We are now learning about different versions of "The Gingerbread Man." We continue to look for "Kids of Character," students who exhibit positive character traits such as showing respect, kindness, and good citizenship.

Parents If you would like to volunteer, please contact your child's teacher or the school front office. We will need many volunteers during the Water Safety classes which will be in April and the upcoming field trips.

Remember parents, please read with your child every night and keep practicing the sight words! Take it to the next level and practice writing sentences using the same words!

If your child has signed up for the FSA tutoring camp, the camp will start when we return from the break. Reading will be on Mondays and math will be on Tuesdays. Your child should also continue to read over the break so they can take AR tests on the books that they have read. Thank you for all that you do to help your child succeed! #### Fourth Grade Features

As the holidays approach, we would like to continue to stress the importance of attendance. It is imperative that your child is at school daily and on time to receive instruction and assistance. Multiple absences or tardies may result in your child falling behind and make it difficult to catch up. It is also important that students attempt homework. The homework allows the students to assess themselves and ask questions before moving on to a new lesson.

Please check your child's agenda daily. Many students are not completing homework or incomplete/make-up work. Homework allows your child to practice the skills they have been taught in class to see what they do or do not understand. Incomplete or missing work needs to be finished to receive a grade.

Math Reminder: It is a third-grade fluency standard for students to know their multiplication and division facts, 1-12, for quick recall. Fluency with single-digit multiplication is essential for success in 4th grade. Please ensure you have a daily 10-minute drill to practice these facts. Ten-Marks is a great tool for success and can provide this extra help that your child needs. Each child should be on Ten-Marks daily. practicing math Students will receive a math packet over the winter break to keep their skills fresh. Please make sure they are working on the packet throughout the break.

Reading Reminder: Students should be reading a MINIMUM of 60 minutes a week. The routine will help both their reading fluency and their comprehension skills. Over the holiday break, students should continue to read. Many children favor fiction books but need to be reading informational texts as well. They should also be practicing their reading skills by logging

onto their I-Ready account over the break at least three times a week.

**Writing Reminder:** The Writing FSA is right around the corner, and some children still struggle with capital letters and punctuation. Students are encouraged to keep a writing journal over the break to practice these skills along with writing complete sentences and staying on a single topic. Students will be given different prompts to practice their writing over the break. Please make sure they are using RACE to write; your child should be able to explain it to you! (It is also in their notebook) FSA testing is quickly approaching, and we want our students to be as prepared as possible. The holiday break is a time for your child to brush up on skills they need to work on and come back in the New Year ready to learn. Students also need to be working on constantly expanding their vocabulary.

We want to wish you all a happy and healthy holiday season and look forward to hitting the ground running when we return!

Holiday Greeting to you all,

It's hard to believe that we are finishing up half the school year already, but we have been very busy this year with many wonderful activities. Most recently was a fantastic Holiday performance. It was great getting into the holiday spirit with the kids performing on their instruments. Their practice paid off, and we will all go into the holiday with a cheerful start. I was happy to see many parents in the audience to share in the fun.

We realize that teaching your children is a privilege, as well as a tremendous responsibility. We also realize we cannot do this alone; we need our parents to be partners in our students, learning process. Our team of fifth-

grade teachers is working diligently teaching our children during the instructional day, and we need our students to continue this in the evenings. Completing their daily assignments supports our children in mastering the concepts taught in the classroom. The day to day academics taking place in the classroom and at home is crucial to your students' success. After the holidays, the students will be taking a BSA. This test will provide valuable information into the students' current level of progress toward the 5<sup>th</sup> grade standards. It is important that students continue to work toward this progress during the long winter break. These tests in January, as well as the reading and math FSA (Florida Standards Assessment) and FCAT Science that the students will take at the end of the year, are rigorous. Our curriculum, therefore, must remain rigorous to make sure that they are best prepared to succeed on those tests.

Students who continue to work during the break will avoid the backward slide that can occur. Along with reading each day and practicing Math skills, there are free computer programs available. Please encourage your child to use the available web-based programs. Students can use their SSO at home to access programs we use in school, such as STEMS scopes, Ten Marks, <u>I ready</u>, vocabulary.com, as well as others. Also, Go Math interactive and MobyMax.com websites are available and offer extra support in all academic areas. Students should be working on these sites to supplement their homework to maximize learning gains. These programs help to build confidence, encourage productive practice and encourages self-monitoring. Most of the programs are prescriptive and adjust to the child's individual academic needs.

As always, attendance and behavior are crucial to academic success. As the children transition back into the school day, please be sure that they are getting plenty of sleep and coming to school with all the materials necessary to focus on learning. It is also important that they leave any unnecessary items at home; such as toys and other items that may be a distraction from the learning process. If you haven't already done so, please sign up for Remind, an app that allows you to

# communicate with your child's teachers easily.

Also, please remember that the *winter* packet and Biz-Town Projects are due in January upon student return to school. Please do not wait until the last minute to work on them.

Working together, your support from home and our teamwork in school, we can help all the children achieve success. ©

#### **Teaching Tip**

**Inferencing** is important skill good reader will use as they interact with the text. Inferencing in reading is the act of using evidence from the text, along with prior knowledge to conclude. As a parent, it may be difficult to keep track of all the skills your child needs to know and understand to be a successful reader. The good news is that research shows that the amount of independent reading done by students both at school and at home is one of the most important predictors of school success. Independent reading refers to the reading students choose to do on their own. This reading is done for pleasure or to learn more information on a self-selected topic. As your child reads, help them understand inferencing by asking guiding questions. A few samples are listed below.

A love for independent reading is fostered by providing students with opportunities to select a wide variety of texts at their current reading level. Over the holiday break, it is important that our students continue to read not only independently, but also with guidance. Students should continue to sharpen their reading comprehension skills; please allow them to use **I-Ready** and **A.R** over the break.

It's hard to believe it is almost Winter Break! It will also inform instruction and support for our students before the Florida Standards Assessment (FSA). The testing window is scheduled between January 8 - February 8, 2019. Grade-level specific dates will be communicated to you via a letter that is sent home with your students – be on the lookout for that information!

Please remember that you play an important role in your student's academic success! You can help your student perform at his/ her best by ensuring that your student gets a good night's sleep prior to testing, is present and on time for school, and that he/she eats a healthy breakfast before coming to school (Note: Free Universal Breakfast is provided in the cafeteria every day beginning at 7:15 AM until 7:45 AM).

This quarter, our fifth-grade students enjoyed in-school presentations from many area middle schools with magnet programs, as well as a field trip to Olsen Middle School. I encourage you to hold a family meeting to discuss potential options for your student's future.
