In Marine Science Honors students have been getting their hands messy with labs. Students completed a food-based plate tectonics lab where students got to see the different tectonic plate boundaries and how they interact in a fun and interesting way.

Technology Studies welcomed a new batch of Sophomore students this

January. Our course is the opportunity to explore the many different trades that Sheridan Technical College has to offer. The students have been busy learning about themselves with <u>Career Assessment quizzes</u> in hopes that they will move toward a career they will enjoy and succeed in versus simply going to work at a j-o-b for an hourly wage. We promote professionalism and <u>soft skills valued in the workforce</u>. Each week students receives a <u>Class Dojo</u> grade reflecting their professionalism within class and while on field trips to STC.
