• The graduation requirement of 40 service hours has been waived. This does not apply to Bright Futures Scholarship and other scholarship opportunities.

• The remainder of the school year will happen "virtually." In other words, we will not be going back to face-to-face school this school year.

All End of Course exams are cancelled.

• A.P. exams are being held online and will all involve a writing component only – no multiple choice. Your A.P. teacher will contact you with more details. Some of the dates are times are being changed to make sure they don't overlap.

• In light of the park closings, we are anticipating the cancellation of Grad Bash, but we are waiting for details from the district.

That's it for right now. We have not been given specific information about prom, last day of school for seniors or what is going to happen with the graduation ceremony, but as soon as we know, we will communicate that information to you - so **check your Outlook regularly**.

BROWARD COLLEGE – Seniors, check your Outlook for updates from Mrs. DiAlberto about BC Jumpstart Program. If you have applied and are on her list (it was sent out), then go to the link she provided for Orientation. We are planning on doing Registration (where you actually select your classes) on April 9.

FAU – The May 1 deadline for deposits if you will be attending FAU has not changed. If your parent's financial situation has changed due to COVID 19, contact your Financial Aid Advisor at FAU.

FSU - The May 1 deadline for deposits if you will be attending UCF has not changed.

UCF - The May 1 deadline for deposits if you will be attending UCF has not changed. Orientation registration for summer & fall students is available on the FIRST YEAR EXPERIENCE part of UCF's website. At this time, plans for orientation remain "as is." Should dates, costs, or mode of delivery change, registered students will be notified. You must submit a \$200 enrollment deposit or qualify for a waiver before signing up for Orientation.
