Criterion #2: Alternative Assessment	Scores acceptable level of performance on a state-approved achievement test in reading comprehension.		
Criterion #3: Portfolio Assessment	Scores acceptable level of performance on the state-approved English Language Arts portfolio assessment.		
Criterion #4: Summer Assessment/Alternative Assessment	Scores acceptable level of performance on the state-approved reading assessment (administered at the end of the Reading Academy for Third Grade Promotion in the summer following third grade retention).		
Criterion #5: Mid-Year Assessment/Alternative Assessment	Scores acceptable level of performance on the Broward Standards Assessment (BSA) for English Language Arts (administered in September following third grade retention).		
Criterion #6: Previous Retention	Student has received intensive reading intervention and was previously retained in K-3 for a maximum total of two years, not to exceed one retention per grade level.

Criterion #9: ESE Previous Retention	Student with a disability participating in statewide assessment, has an Individual Education Plan (IEP) or a Section 504 Plan reflecting intensive instruction for more than two years, and was previously retained in grades K-3.		


Fountas and Pinnell's

Benchmark Assessment System (BAS)



- Given up to 3 times per year
- Extensive training and rubric used to assess decoding, fluency, and comprehension
- Identifies independent, instructional, and frustration reading levels
- Independent reading level is where students should be reading at home
- Instructional is with guidance

LAFS (Language Arts Florida Standards) is the Language Arts book used daily in a teacher center. The workbook is focused on Florida State Standards, and is aligned to skills presented on the state test. The book is rigorous and includes a variety of ways to answer questions such as multiple response, short response, extended response, graphic organizers, and multiple selection answers. It also includes excerpts from informational text and literature pieces including poetry.

Spelling Students are assigned spelling words based on their performance on a spelling pretest. Words are assigned at the beginning of each week. Students study their words each day for homework by completing a spelling menu item. The day before the test they study however they'd like.







- Make essential reading practice more effective for every student.






What are Thinking Maps?

Thinking Maps are consistent visual patterns linked directly to eight specific thought processes. By visualizing our thinking, we create concrete images of abstract thoughts. These patterns help all students reach higher levels of critical and creative thinking — essential components of 21st Century education. In a school-wide implementation, Thinking Maps establish a consistent Language for Learning.




