Grab & Go Meals

Free curbside grab-and-go meals continue to be available at other school locations, the closest school being Chapel Trail Elementary School. Meals are distributed every Tuesday and Thursday for free for all children 18 years and younger. Beginning on Thursday, February 4, Sunday meals will now be included in meal bundles on Thursdays. Tuesday meal bundles will include meals for Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday, while Thursday meal bundles will include meals for Friday, Saturday, Sunday and Monday. Please visit Browardschools.com/foodservice or call 211 for available sites and times. Children or their parents can drive or walk up to receive meal bundles. Parents must bring identification for their child, like a student ID, birth certificate, or report card to pick up meals at each distribution if the child is not present. We encourage our families to take advantage of free nutritious meals so all children can power up. Please remember to wear a mask & follow CDC guidelines. West Broward High School is also open for distribution on the same days from 4:00 – 5:00 p.m. as a convenient later option for families to pick up meals for their children.

Mask Information

According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) the purpose of face coverings is to keep respiratory droplets from reaching others to aid with source control. However, face coverings with one-way valves or vents allow air to be exhaled through a hole in the material, which can result in expelled respiratory droplets that can reach others. This type of face covering does not prevent the person wearing the face covering from transmitting COVID-19 to others. Therefore, CDC does not recommend using face coverings if they have an exhalation valve or vent.

Important Laptop Computer Reminders for All Students/Parents

- 1. If your device is not working properly, please contact the office at 754-323-6850 to schedule a tech support appointment.
- 2. Be sure your child shuts the computer off daily and restarts it in the morning to refresh and receive any software updates.
- 3. Ensure that the device will be used only for school assignments and work.
- 4. Ensure that unauthorized software will not be loaded/installed on the device.
- 5. Ensure that there will be no tampering with the hardware or software setup of the device.
- 6. Provide parental supervision in the use of the device for educational purposes and ensure its proper care.
- 7. Ensure that your child does not lend the device to others.
- 8. In case of loss or damage, the borrower will replace device at original purchase price.

Need Homework Help, Ask BRIA

Ask BRIA (the Broward Remote Instructional Assistant). Does your child need help with their homework assignments after school? Would you like your child to receive this assistance from teacher? just certified **If** SO, Ask BRIA. a district's free homework help program which is available to students Monday through Thursday, from 3:15 pm to 7:15 pm. To access Ask BRIA your child should 1. Log into the Canvas Course, 2. Click on the Ask BRIA link in the lower left-hand corner, and 3. Complete a request form and submit. Open Microsoft Teams and wait for a Virtual call from an Ask BRIA certified educator who will work with the student one-on-one. Get your children to listen the first time

What you say and how you say it can make a world of difference when you need your child to listen. Consider these tips to curb nagging and encourage better listening.

Get close: Your youngster is more apt to listen when you're face-to-face. So try not to shout instructions from another room or across the yard—or to text them to her. It's also a good idea to get her attention before you start talking ("Hey, there's something you need to do..."). Then, have her repeat your instructions ("I'm supposed to put my scooter in the garage") so you know she has heard and understood you.

Slow down. Too many instructions at once can overwhelm your child. Instead of rattling off a bunch of tasks (put away your laundry, do your homework, take out the trash), give her one at a time. Or suggest that she write them down and check off each one as she completes it. She can come back and proudly show you her finished list.

Give options: Say your youngster often procrastinates when you tell her to get dressed in the morning. Instead of nagging, you could ask, "Are you going to wear sweatpants or jeans today?" Or if you find yourself repeatedly telling her to eat her vegetables, you might try, "Do you want carrots or broccoli?" Giving her a say will make her more apt to listen and respond.

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Celebrate Earth Day

Show the Earth some love on April 22—and every day. Here are activities that will help the planet and boost your child's math and research skills.

Calculate and conserve. A typical showerhead sprays out 5 gallons of water per minute. Have your youngster time his next shower and multiply the number of minutes by 5. If his shower took 8 minutes, he used 40 gallons of water (8 \times 5 = 40). Encourage family members to time their showers, too. Then, ask everyone to trim 2 minutes off their showers, and let your child calculate how much water your family saved.

Try plant-based foods. Eating less meat is an eco-friendly habit that's also healthy for your youngster. Ask him to research plant-based alternatives to some of the meat-based foods your family eats. He might find recipes for black bean burgers, shiitake mushroom "bacon," and eggplant "steaks." Make and try them together. *Idea:* Consider committing to one meatless day per week. Your child can choose the recipe—or come up with his own.

Panther Run FSA TESTING DATES May 2020-2021 3rd, 4th & 5th Grades

FSA Testing will begin at 8:15 a.m. on the assigned day and end at approximately 10:30 a.m. Please have your child (ren) arrive on campus between 7:30 a.m. and 7:55 a.m. on their assigned testing day(s).

Face to face on campus students will report to their classroom upon arrival on testing days and will move to testing areas at the designated time. F2F students will resume instruction in their classrooms once testing is over for the day and a supervised break period.

Remote e-learning students will report to the cafeteria upon arrival on testing days. These students will be dismissed after testing (approximately 10:45 a.m.) to go home to join classes remotely unless riding a school bus. Bus riders will stay for the remainder of the day and be dismissed at 2:00 p.m.

General Education Testing Students: Students who do not test in small groups due to an IEP, 504 or ELL Plan accommodation will take the FSA test with their classroom teacher in the cafeteria. Our cafeteria is set up with student desks 7 feet apart. The cafeteria is thoroughly cleaned throughout the school day and every evening. Students will wear masks while taking the test. Desks will be cleaned after testing is over in time for lunch to begin in the cafeteria.

Small Group Designated Testing Students: Students who have an IEP, 504 or ELL Plan accommodation for FSA Testing will take their grade level test in classrooms set up for testing with their assigned testing facilitator and small group. Student desks in classrooms are 6 feet apart. ALL classrooms are thoroughly cleaned throughout the school day and every evening. Small group students will wear masks while taking the test. Desks/rooms will be cleaned after testing is over.

Students must wear a mask to school and while on campus. We ask that students also bring a spare mask to have just in case it is needed. They should also bring a bottle of water. Water fountains have been retrofitted into bottle fillers so they will be able to refill water bottles if necessary.

AT HOME DAILY HEALTH SCREENING



Broward County Public Schools is committed to the health and safety of our students, our staff and our community. The District has instituted enhanced cleaning schedules, staggered work schedules and continues to reduce the number of people in our facilities to promote physical distancing.

In order to enter Broward County Public Schools facilities, all students, parents/caregivers, and employees should answer the following self-assessment questions at home each morning prior to coming to school or work:

DAILY HEALTH SELF ASSESSMENT QUESTIONS:



Do you feel warm, have a fever or elevated temperature (100.4), or have the chills?



Do you have a persistent cough, runny nose or sore throat?



Have you recently had a loss of taste or smell?



Has anyone in your household tested positive for COVID-19?



Have you been in close, unprotected contact with anyone who has tested positive for COVID-19?

(spent longer than 15 minutes within six feet of someone who was sick with a fever and cough or confirmed/suspected of having COVID-19)



Are you feeling sick or ill today?



Are you awaiting test results for COVID-19?



Have you been told to self-quarantine or self-isolate by a doctor or the Florida Department of Health?



If your child can answer "NO" to all of these questions, they may proceed to school.



If your child answered "YES" to any of these questions, <u>do not send your child to school</u>. Contact the school nurse for further guidance.

Mask Wearing Tips For STAFF & Students Whose Parents Answered the Reopening survey with the answer that their child will Return to campus for Face-To-Face (F2F) On campus e-Learning

We advise all staff and their child(ren)/students start practicing now for wearing their mask all day at school. They can wear it during e-Learning at home to get used to wearing it. Start out for a brief time and slowly build up to add time until they can wear it for the school day. Masks are required at school except when eating lunch or snack and outside during PE or recess and properly socially distanced. Masks will be worn on buses and at car line as well.


