

HOW TO ACCESS TEST SCORES & GRADES (FSA, FCAT 2.0, ETC...)

STEP 1- Log on to your student's Single Sign-On

Username: Student Number

<u>Password</u>: P00/00/0000. Check with the student to see if the password has been changes.

(You will land on their CLEVER homepage.)

STEP 2 - Click on the "Virtual Counselor" option. (If you do not see the Virtual Counselor option type "Virtual Counselor in the search bar at the top.)

STEP 3 - Under "Student Info" choose the **Test Scores OR Grades** to see your student's test scores and/or report cards.
