STEP 1- Log on to your student's Single Sign-On

STEP 2 - Click on the "Virtual Counselor" option. (If you do not see the Virtual Counselor option type "Virtual Counselor in the search bar at the top.)

STEP 3 – Under "Student Info" choose the **Test Scores** to see your student's test scores.
