# Significant Economic Value

2018-2019 Award Amounts (4 Year University Rates)\*

Florida Academic Scholars (FAS) Award = 100 % of tuition and applicable fees (\$212.28 per credit hour) + \$300.00 per semester for college related expenses (fall and spring term)

Florida Medallion Scholars (FMS) Award = 75 % of tuition and applicable fees ( $\$212.28 \times 75\% = \$159.21$  per credit hour)

Effective fall 2017, Florida Academic Scholars Bright Futures recipients will receive 100% of tuition and applicable fees plus an additional \$300 for college related expenses.

# Approximate Savings Calculations in Higher Education

## **\$ 638.13 Per Class:**

\$212.71 per credit hour X 3 (average credits per class) = \$638.13

## **\$ 2,552.52 Per Semester**

\$638.13 per class X 4 (average course load per semester) = \$2,552.52

## **\$ 20,420.16 Over Four Years:**

\$2,552.52 X 8 (average # of years to complete undergrad) = \$20,552.52

# Housing Costs Virtually Disappear Year One of Undergraduate Study

With an AICE Diploma, students will omit nearly an entire year of school...they enter as FTIC (First Time in College) Sophomores...as long as they take one additional Acceleration Course. Therefore,

Average Room and Board (on campus and meal plan) for one year:

**\$ 10,300.00**

To be sure, this is an estimate and costs may be somewhat lower.
