College is a challenging environment by design. Colleges and post-secondary Military Academies pursue their mission by inspiring and encouraging excellence in their applicants. Oftentimes, competition for entrance to your preferred college or for an appointment to a Military Academy is fierce. In assessing the "whole person," universities and Military Academies assess academic, athletic (in the case of Military Academies), character, and leadership potential as demonstrated by the life experiences and achievements of each applicant. There are many ways you can prepare yourself to shine in their applicant pools.

How Competitive Is College And Military Academy Admissions?

To get a sense of the level of competition to get into college or a Military Academy, note that many colleges and all Military Academies take the top percent out of the thousands of applicants each year. For example, in the case of a high profile university such as the University of California at Berkeley, only 15% of applicants are admitted.

Consider Boston University. Below is a profile of the freshman class admitted for the fall of 2017.

Total Applicants: 60,815

Total Freshmen: 3,400

Percent Admitted: 25%

Average Rank in High School Class: Top 7%

Average Overall Grade: A-

In the case of the Air Force Academy, they are able to admit just over 1,000 cadets out of some 12,000 that apply each year.

As you can see, the best and the brightest compete for the limited number of admissions and appointments available.

Becoming A Competitive Applicant

If you are interested in pursuing an appointment to a Military Academy, or entrance to your preferred college or university, you can take steps to ensure that your application is competitive by preparing academically and physically (in the case of the Military Academies), through leadership activities and character. In the case of Boston University, they look for students who will create a unique, diverse community at BU: people who are doers—volunteers, entrepreneurs, and artists; students who are passionate about a single pursuit or exploring a wide variety of subjects. That's why they consider extracurricular activities and interests, special

talents and skills, along with recommendations from teachers, counselors, community leaders and others who know you well.
